1. CONSENT AGENDA FOR TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 8, 2026 (items 1 through 16):

a) COMMISSIONERS:

1. Record of the Proceedings for Monday, August 31, 2026.

b) BUDGET AND FINANCE:

3. Amendment No. 1 to Interlocal Cooperative Agreement No. C20250354 with City of Sedro-Woolley to award Economic Development/Public Facilities Projects grant funds to support the Jones/John Liner Railroad Undercrossing Project. This Amendment extends the term of the Agreement to December 31, 2027 to allow sufficient time for project completion. Compensation remains the same and shall not exceed \$750,000. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement shall remain in effect.

c) CORONER:

4. Interlocal Agreement with the King County Medical Examiner's Office for the provision of autopsy and forensic pathology services. Compensation is based on a fee schedule and will be performed contingent upon the King County Medical Examiner's capacity to provide services at the time they are requested by the Skagit County Coroner. The Agreement shall commence on January 1, 2027 and will continue through December 31, 2031.

d) FACILITIES MANAGEMENT:

5. Vendor Services Agreement with Chrome General Contracting, Inc. for the complete repair of the sewer systems outlined in the bidding documents for the Skagit County Community Justice Center located at 201 Suzanne Lane in Mount Vernon. Compensation shall not exceed \$191,295. The Agreement shall commence on the date of execution and continue until December 31, 2026.

e) OFFICE OF JUVENILE COURT:

6. Interagency Agreement with Washington State Administrative Office of the Courts, AOC3673, to provide funding in the amount of \$23,116 to the Office of Juvenile Court for the Language Access and Interpreter Reimbursement Program (LAIRP) to improve access for Limited English Proficient (LEP), deaf, hard of hearing, and deaf/blind individuals in accordance with RCW Chapters 2.42 and 2.43. The Agreement is ratified to commence on July 1, 2026 and shall continue through June 30, 2027.
7. Interlocal Cooperative Agreement with Sedro-Woolley School District to fund a BECCA Case Manager Position to help file truancy petitions, provide truancy intervention, and case management. Compensation to Skagit County shall not exceed \$9,468. The Agreement is ratified to commence on September 1, 2026 and shall continue through August 31, 2027.
8. Interlocal Cooperative Agreement with La Conner School District to fund a BECCA Case Manager Position to help file truancy petitions, provide truancy intervention, and case management. Compensation to Skagit County shall not exceed \$5,050. The Agreement is ratified to commence on September 1, 2026 and shall continue through August 31, 2027.

f) PUBLIC HEALTH:

9. Personal Services Agreement with Skagit Preschool and Resource Center (SPARC) to provide Child Development Services to eligible infants and toddlers with developmental delays and their families living in Skagit County. Compensation is based on a reimbursement for services schedule and shall not exceed \$63,414. The Agreement is ratified to commence on July 1, 2026 and shall continue until June 30, 2027.
10. Interlocal Cooperative Agreement with Burlington-Edison School District to increase capacity for behavioral health prevention programs and activities and provide workforce development opportunities for employees that assist in the provision of behavioral health and recovery support services. Compensation shall not exceed \$35,490. The Agreement is ratified to commence on July 1, 2026 and shall continue through December 31, 2026.
11. Amendment No. 2 to Personal Services Agreement No. C20250392 with NineLine Veteran Services to provide case management and emergency financial assistance for Skagit County Veterans. This Amendment increases case management from 1.0 to 1.5 FTEs, adjusts the hours per week to be worked on site or performing other responsibilities, and adjusts the budget categories. Compensation remains the same and shall not exceed

\$227,516.66. The term remains the same and shall continue until December 31, 2026. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement and prior Amendment shall remain in effect.

g) PUBLIC WORKS:

12. Construction Contract Agreement with Morgan Treeworx for the 2026 Abandoned Railroad Bridge Debris Removal Project #ESMP3-1. Compensation shall not exceed \$207,500. The Agreement shall commence on the date of execution and continue until project acceptance.

h) RISK MANAGEMENT:

13. Personal Services Agreement with Bostec, Inc. to support compliance for training, testing, and qualification requirements to meet Department of Transportation and U.S. Coast Guard regulations. Compensation is based on a rate schedule and shall not exceed \$15,000. The Agreement shall commence on January 1, 2027 and continue until December 31, 2027.
14. Renewal of Insurance Agreement with Ironshore/Liberty Surplus Insurance Corporation for underground storage tanks at County-owned sites located at 44510 Concrete Sauk Valley Road in Concrete, 600 South 3rd Street in Mount Vernon, and 201 Avon Avenue in Burlington. Policy premium shall not exceed \$38,449.37. The Agreement shall commence on September 12, 2026 and continue until September 12, 2027.

i) SHERIFF:

15. Amendment No. 1 to Personal Services Agreement No. C20210562 with Public Safety Psychological Services to provide psychological examinations for potential and existing employees of the Skagit County Sheriff's Office on an as needed basis. This Amendment updates the Scope of Work and includes compensation rates for the provision of Fit for Duty Evaluations and Court Testimony. The term remains the same and shall continue until December 31, 2027. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement shall remain in effect.

j) SUPERIOR COURT:

16. Interagency Agreement with Washington State Administrative Office of the Courts, AOC3637, to provide funding in the amount of \$80,593 to Superior Court for the Language Access and Interpreter Reimbursement Program (LAIRP) to improve access for Limited English Proficient (LEP), deaf, hard of hearing, and deaf/blind individuals in accordance with RCW Chapters 2.42 and 2.43. The Agreement is ratified to commence on July 1, 2026 and shall continue through June 30, 2027.
