ADDITIONAL IMPORTANT INFO

Space assignments, made by Fair staff (Lisa-Camping Coordinator), will start after May 1st deadline. Placement requests will be accommodated to the best of our ability for applications received by May 1st. Once space assignments are completed, you will be contacted by Fairgrounds staff by May 15th with your space # and a request for payment. At that point you can send in payment in full to secure your space. Payment will be due by June 21st Also please note, After May 1st, applications for dry camping will be accepted, if space is available and assigned to empty spots as they come in.

Campers will be allowed to drop off trailers/set up camp starting on Sunday, August 4th. All trailers/campers will need to be removed from the Fairgrounds property no later than 8:00 p.m. on Tuesday, August 13th. Due to security reasons, Campers will not be allowed to stay overnight in their designated site until the night of Wednesday, August 7th. The last night campers will be allowed to stay in their designated site will be the night of Sunday, August 11th.

CONTINUED ON OTHER SIDE

GUIDELINES:

- 1. Applications will only be accepted from the person who will be camping in the space provided and who will be the responsible party.
- 2. All campers must have proof of paid admissions (wristband or ticket) to the Fair as well as a camping vehicle pass (included with the space) to gain access to the camping area
- 3. Only <u>ONE</u> automobile (towing vehicle counts as one and only permissible vehicle) may be parked in, or at, a camping site. Any vehicle blocking traffic or fire lanes will be towed at the owner's expense.
- 4. Dry Camping: \$110 flat fee, With Hookups: \$160 flat fee.

RULES OF CONDUCT:

- 1. The possession and/or use of alcoholic beverages or drugs, other than prescribed medication, are prohibited.
- 2. Smoking on Fairgrounds property at any location is prohibited.
- 3. Persons under 18 years of age **MUST** have an adult chaperone.
- 4. No animals/pets are allowed in the campsites and/or Fairgrounds (except service animals) unless they are being exhibited at the Fair.
- 5. Fire lanes must be kept open. Any vehicles in violation will be towed at the owner's expense.
- Obscene and discriminatory language, disrespect of Fair staff, volunteers, other campers, exhibitors, vendors, contractors, etc., will result in immediate dismissal from the fairgrounds and forfeiture of premiums.
- 7. Damage to, or destruction of, property belonging to others is strictly prohibited. This includes tampering with or disconnecting water or electrical services from another campsite and may result in additional charges and/or immediate dismissal and forfeiture of premiums.
- 8. Quiet hours 10PM to 6AM
- 9. All Campers must comply with Title 9 Chapter 9.41 & 9.42 governs Skagit County Parks. These rules and regulations are strictly enforced.
