PROPOSED BY INITIATIVE PETITION:

INITIATIVE TO THE PEOPLE 776

Initiative Measure No. 776 concerns state and local government charges on motor vehicles. This measure would require license tab fees to be \$30 per year for motor vehicles, including light trucks. Certain local-option vehicle excise taxes and fees used for roads and transit would be repealed.

PROPOSED BY REFERENDUM PETITION:

REFERENDUM MEASURE 53

The legislature passed Engrossed House Bill 2901 (EHB 2901) concerning unemployment insurance [and voters have filed a sufficient referendum petition on parts of this bill]. This bill would revise laws regarding unemployment insurance for employers, including establishing new employer rate classes, increasing some taxable wage bases, and imposing surcharges if certain contingencies occur.

PROPOSED TO THE PEOPLE BY THE LEGISLATURE:

REFERENDUM BILL 51

The Legislature has passed House Bill No. 2969, financing transportation improvements through transportation fees and taxes. This bill would increase highway capacity, public transportation, passenger and freight rail, and transportation financing accountability through increased fuel excise taxes, sales taxes on vehicles, and weight fees on trucks and large vehicles.

AMENDMENT TO THE STATE CONSTITUTION PROPOSED BY THE LEGISLATURE:

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 4220

The legislature has proposed a constitutional amendment on fire protection property tax levies. This amendment would permit property tax levy propositions for fire protection districts to be submitted to voters for periods up to four years, or six years for fire facility construction, rather than annually.

SKAGIT COUNTY PROPOSITION NO. 1 SALES AND USE TAX FOR EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEMS AND FACILITIES

The Skagit County Board of Commissioners adopted Resolution No. R20020328 concerning a sales and use tax for emergency communications systems and facilities. This proposition authorizes a sales tax at the rate of one-tenth of one percent of the selling price, and use tax at the rate of one-tenth of one percent of the value of the article used, consistent with RCW 82.14, to be used solely for the purpose of providing funds for the costs associated with financing, designing, acquiring, constructing, equipping, operating, maintaining, remodeling, repairing, re-equipping, and improving emergency communication systems and facilities. AUTHORIZING PROPERTY TAX
LEVY**

The Board of Commissioners of Skagit County Fire Protection District No. 9 adopted Resolution No. 139 concerning a property tax levy. This proposition would lift the 101% limitation restoring the levy rate to \$1.00 per \$1,000.00 of assessed valuation, which does not exceed the statutory limit authorized by law, to provide the Fire District with more revenue in order to purchase necessary equipment to adequately supply the residents of the district with fire suppression capabilities. GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS
c \$150,000**

The Board of Commissioners of Skagit County Fire Protection District No. 16 adopted Resolution No. 162 concerning general obligation bonds. This proposition authorizes the District to acquire a pumper fire truck with related equipment, to issue \$150,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within a maximum term of 20 years to finance and refinance such improvements, and to levy property taxes annually in excess of regular property tax levies to repay such bonds, all as provided in Resolution No. 162. PROTECTION DISTRICT NO. 19
PROPOSITION NO. 1
EXCESS LEVY FOR BUILDING
AND EQUIPMENT
IMPROVEMENTS**

The Board of Commissioners of Skagit County Fire Protection District No. 19 adopted Resolution No. 115 concerning an excess levy for building and equipment improvements. This proposition authorizes an excess tax levy of \$80,000.00 (approximately \$1.29 per thousand dollars of assessed valuation) in excess of the maximum regular levy allowed by statute to be used to help finance a remodel of the Fire Hall located in Rockport and to acquire new firefighting equipment, all as provided in Resolution No. 115.
