**Proposition No. 1
Levy for Basic Public Safety,
Essential Services and
Improvements**

The Mount Vernon City Council adopted Resolution 1078, concerning funding for essential community services and improvements. This proposition would provide funds for increased essential community services and improvements, including City fire and police personnel, fire equipment and parks maintenance and improvements. It authorizes a maximum regular property tax levy for collection in 2026 of \$2.2537/\$1,000 of assessed valuation (increased approximately \$0.6525/\$1,000 from 2025). The 2026 levy amount will be used to compute the limitations under RCW 84.55. Qualifying persons are exempt under RCW 84.36.381.

Property Tax Levy for Fire Protection and Emergency Medical Services

The Board of Skagit County Fire Protection District No. 8 adopted Resolution No. 6-2025 concerning a proposition to maintain and adequately fund District operations.

This proposition would finance fire protection and emergency medical services by restoring the District's regular property tax levy in 2025 to an amount not to exceed \$1.25 per \$1,000.00 of assessed valuation and authorize setting the limit factor at 103% for each of the following five years. The maximum allowable levy in the final year shall serve as the base for subsequent levy limitations as provided by Chapter 84.55 RCW.

Joint Proposition No. 1
Fidalgo Metropolitan Recreation
District

Skagit County Commissioners adopted Resolution R20250168 and Anacortes City Council adopted Resolution 3184, concerning a joint proposition to form a metropolitan park district. If approved, it would create the Fidalgo Metropolitan Recreation District with the powers in 35.61 RCW to operate the Fidalgo Pool and Fitness Center Campus. The District would be governed by a five-member board to be elected at large, with boundaries coterminous with the Anacortes School District. The District would levy a maximum property tax rate for 2027 of \$0.12/\$1000 of assessed valuation.
