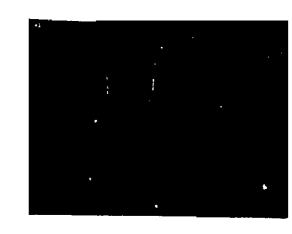

GUARANTY

THIS GUARANTY is made and entered into as of November $\frac{\sqrt{3}}{\sqrt{5}}$, 1997, by Ron Rennebohm, as his separate obligation ("Guarantor") to and for the benefit of Michael D. Mitchell and Dorothea F. Mitchell, husband and wife ("Lender").

RECITALS

Guarantor waives notice of any breach or default by Borrower.
