Dear Mr. and Mrs. Kelly:

On April 13, 2001, an illegal methamphetamine drug lab was confiscated by the Washington State Patrol and the Mount Vernon Drug Task Force while executing a search warrant at the above address. Due to the evidence of methamphetamine manufacture on the property the Skagit County Health Department designated the property unfit for use on April 27, 2001.

On September 6, 2001 certified drug lab clean up contractors Theresa Borst and Stacy Haney of Bio Clean LLC supervised removal of contaminated items and chemicals from the

property. They supervised the thorough cleaning of the inside of the home and the back patio over a period of 4 days. The septic tank contents were analyzed for volatile organic compounds on September 6 and the septic tank pumped on September 19, 2001. On September 12, 2001 Theresa Borst and Stacy Haney took post clean up swab samples inside the house and of the cleaned wood furniture and had them analyzed for methamphetamine. Methamphetamine was not detected in any of the swabs. On September 21, 2001 I reviewed their final clean up report on the property and found all work acceptable.

The information upon which the property was originally declared unfit for use has been addressed by the above clean up and final sampling on the property. The Skagit County Health Department has released this property for use.

As legal owners of the property, you are responsible for notifying all future inhabitants, buyers or real estate agents that the property was used as an illegal drug lab. A fact sheet about illegal methamphetamine labs is enclosed with this letter. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.
