

Suggested plant list: One or a mix of species should be planted to fill in bare soil areas on top of and around the bulk head and pockets between rocks in the bulk head. Plants selected do well in lake shore environments and offer habitat for birds and compatibility with the home owners views, access and aesthetics. Trailing ground cover types: Quantity/size: minimum of twenty 4"-6" pots. Plant as needed to fill rockery

'pockets' and bare soil around rockery. Kinnikinnick (Arctostaphylos uva-ursi), wild strawberry (Fragaria virginiana). bunch berry (Cornus Canadensis)

Low to Medium shrubs: Ouantity/size: Five I gallon pots. Sword ferns (Polystichum munitum), Red flowering currant (Ribes sanguineum.) Common juniper (Juniperus communis), Mock Orange (Philadelphus lewisii)



## Notes:

Protected Critical Area (PCA) is that area waterward of the PCA Boundary.

The plant list is only suggested. There are many native species that can be substituted for these suggestions. It is important to make sure the existing areas of bare soil are planted, the quantity of shrubs are installed and after construction of the new addition all bare soil is rescoded with grass or plants.
