If Father has adequate housing facilities he is to be allowed to have the children for summer visitation for a period of two weeks. Father to notify Mother not less than two weeks before as to the date he intends to have such visitation DECREE OF DISSOLUTION

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c. Support: Support for each dependent child shall be paid by Respondent to Petitioner at the rate of \$75.00 per month per child, commencing as of the 10th day of March,1974, and shall continue until each child reaches the age of 18 years, becomes self-supporting, married or deceased, whichever event occurs firs.

3. Property and liabilities: The separation agreement is approved and the parties are ordered to comply with its terms.

WRITTEN SEPARATION AGREEMENT

JAMES E. PITNER, 8

Respondent.

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This is a Written Separation Agreement entered into by Bertha A. Pitner, hereinafter called "Wife", and James E. Pitner, hereinafter called "Husband".

The parties hereto were married on December 16, 1957, in 14 Anacortes, Skagit County, Washington, and ever since have been and now are husband and wife. The parties have the following minor children, namely: JAMES EDWARD PITNER, 11., born February 20, 1959; TIMOTHY HORACE PITNER, born December 31, 1960; GINGER ANN PITNER, born February 20, 1962 and TRACY LYNN PITNER, born April 6, 1965. Certain differences have arisen in the marital life of the parties, as a result of which the parties are desirous of effecting a settlement and disposition of their property and rights in connection with this marriage. Now, therefore, in consideration of the mutual promises herein contained and in consideration of the desire of the parties to make an amicable settlement of their differences, and in further consideration of the mutual benefits to be derived from this agreement, it is agreed as follows: 27

- Custody of Children: The care, custody and control of the 28 minor children of the parties shall be awarded to the Wife. 29
- Visitation: Husband shall have reasonable rights of visitation with the minor children which shall include but not be 31 limited to the following visitation: the right to have visitation CERTIFIED COPY with the children outside of the mother's home every other weekend 32 while Husband is not away at sea. Husb

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ments with Wife by telephone on the days he plans to exercise his visitation rights. If Husband has adequate housing facilities he is to be allowed to have the children for summer visitation for a period of two weeks. Husband to notify Wife not less than two weeks before as to the date he intends to have such visitation.

- 4. Attorneys' Fees: Attorneys' fees shall be paid for by Husband with the refund due from the Internal Revenue Service. Said refund shall be applied to both attorneys' fees.
- 5. Distribution of Real Estate: Wife shall have awarded to lo her the family home of the parties located at 1614 36th Street, Anacortes, Skagit County, Washington, subject to the indebtedness thereon in the amount of \$110.00 monthly payments. Husband shall sign papers in connection with the transfer of the home to the Wife.
- 6. <u>Distribution of Automobiles</u>: Wife shall be awarded the 13 1967 Buick automobile and Husband shall be awarded the Oldsmobile automobile. Both parties shall sign release of interest to the other.
- 7. Medical Insurance: So long as Husband is employed in the United States Navy he shall see that the minor children have the proper identification cards for medical expenses with the U. S. Navy.
- 8. Payment of Debts: Each party shall be responsible for any debts incurred by them after the date of separation, said date being July 2, 1973. Husband shall assume and pay debts incurred prior to that time. Wife has had at her disposal certain credit cards which are in Husband's name. Any charges against said cards since the date of separation and made by Wife shall be her responsibility. Any credit cards in Husband's name and in Wife's possession shall be returned to him upon the signing of this Agreement.
- 9. Income Tax Deductions: Husband shall have the right to claim the minor children as exemptions for income tax purposes for each year he makes support payments provided for in this agreement. Wife shall not claim these children as income tax exemptions for any year in which Husband makes support payments provided for, and Wife shall, following the close of each calendar year, provide Husband with a statement that he has paid all support due and owing under the Agreement if such be the fact.
 - 10. Property to be Conveyed to Wife: Wife shall have as her separate property, free of any liens or claims of Husband, the following:
 - (a) All the furniture and furnishings located in the family except as stated below in No. 11.
 - (b) Any bank accounts in Wife's name only.
 - (c) Miscellaneous personal property, clothing and personal effects of Wife and the minor children of the parties.
 - (d) Handyman's Encylopedia to be left for the use of the boys.
