SUPPLEMENTAL NOTICE AND ORDER TO ABATE

Site visits by County staff and by the Washington State Department of Ecology on July 26, 2007, have confirmed that native wetland and buffer vegetation has been cleared and that fill has been placed within a wetland and waterward of the ordinary high water mark of Big Lake on parcel P61964. These activities are inconsistent with the policies of the Shoreline Management Act and requirement of the Skagit County Shoreline Master Program (SMP) and therefore constitute shoreline violations. These activities are also in violation of Skagit County Code (SCC) 14.24, the Critical Areas Ordinance (CAO).

The Supplemental Notice & Order to Abate, dated September 22, 2009, required all elements of the restoration plan to be completed no later than October 30, 2009. That deadline was extended to November 30, 2009 based on a brief meeting with Mr. Sager and a request received by email on October 30, 2009. The reason for the extension was due to the difficulty is obtaining the required plants for the restoration project. The November 30, 2009 deadline was not met and the request for an additional extension was not received until December 3, 2009 (by email).

The Administrative Official has found that you are in continuing violation of Titles 14 and/or 15 of the Skagit County Code (SCC) and land use regulations or statutes as follows:

1. SCC 14.24.060: Requires that any land use activity that can impair the functions and values of critical areas or their associated buffers through a development activity or by disturbance of the soil, water, and/or by removal or damage to, existing vegetation shall require critical

areas review and written authorization pursuant to this Chapter. This authorization has not been obtained.

You are hereby ordered to take the following action to abate the above violations:

- Complete installation of the fence along the PCA boundary no later than December 31, 2009.
- Provide photo documentation of all restoration activities (fill removal, partial plant installation, fence along PCA boundary, etc) no later than December 31, 2009.
- Complete the remaining elements of the restoration plan no later than no later than April 30,
- Provide photo documentation of remaining elements of the restoration plan no later than April 30, 2010.
- 5. Install and maintain all necessary erosion and sedimentation control measures for as long as necessary to prevent sediment from entering Big Lake and associated wetlands.
- 6. Pay the civil penalty of \$5000 no later than January 30, 2010. This penalty is reasonable given the landowner's failure to meet previous deadlines, the continued costs of enforcement, and the nature and extent of the violation (SCC 14.44.080(4)(b)).

A further civil penalty of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) is hereby assessed pursuant to SCC 14.44.030(2) for each day that any violation noted above continues past listed deadlines. All civil penalties will be enforced and collected as authorized by law.

Failure to comply with this order may result in referral to the Prosecuting Attorney's office for further enforcement action including court action and additional civil penalties.

If the required corrective work is not commenced or completed within the time allotted, the Administrative Official may cause the work to be done. Any county costs incurred to abate the violation(s) will be charged as a public nuisance lien against the property. A public nuisance lien may violate the terms of your real estate loan and Deed of Trust or Mortgage. It may cause your lender to start foreclosure proceedings against your property. If you have any questions about that, please contact your lender.

Appeal to the Skagit County Hearing Examiner: This order becomes final fifteen (15) days after service unless you file a timely appeal with the Skagit County Hearing Examiner. Applications for appeals are available from Skagit County Planning and Development Services. Appeals must be made in writing and submitted, along with the required fees, to Planning and Development Services within fourteen (14) calendar days of service of this Notice and Order to Abate. Appeals will be processed under Chapter 14.06 SCC.
