DESMARAIS RECIPROCAL DURABLE POWER OF ATTORNEY

THE UNDERSIGNED spouses, each as principal, residing in the state of Washington, reciprocally and individually name the following persons in the alternative as Attorney-in-Fact for either spouse who may hereafter become disabled or incompetent.

- 1. <u>Designation of Attorney-in-Fact</u>: The other spouse, if living, able, and willing to serve, is designated as Attorney-in-Fact for the disabled or incompetent spouse as principal. If either spouse is deceased or is unable or unwilling to act, then and in that event DENNIS A. DESMARAIS, of Beaverton, Oregon, is designated as Attorney-in-Fact to act for ALFRED D. DESMARAIS or ELAINE Y. DESMARAIS as principals. In the event that DENNIS A. DESMARAIS is unable or unwilling to act, then and in that event ROBERT C. DESMARAIS, of Mount Vernon, Washington, is designated as Attorney-in-Fact to act for ALFRED D. DESMARAIS or ELAINE Y. DESMARAIS as principals.
- 2. <u>Powers of Attorney-in-Fact</u>: The Attorney-in-Fact, as fiduciary, shall have and exercise all powers the principal would have if alive and competent, subject only to the exceptions mandated by Chapter 11.94 RCW, as amended. The Attorney-in-Fact shall not have the power to revoke or change any estate planning or testamentary documents, or trust agreements, unless the document authorizes changes with court approval. By way of illustration and not as a limitation Exhibit "A" and Exhibit "B" attached hereto enumerate specific authorization for actions which may be exercised by the Attorney-in-Fact.
- 3. Optional Powers. As an expression of each principal's intent to grant more than general powers to the named Attorney-in-Fact, the principal hereby authorizes continued making of gifts authorized in Exhibit "A" or Exhibit "B" attached hereto. In the exercise of discretion, the principal also authorizes the named Attorney-in-Fact to carry out a plan of giving to maintain the principals' combined estate within the limits of any state or federal estate and gift tax unified credit equivalent or to promote the welfare of a spouse or descendants. Each principal specifically authorizes disclaimer of any gift or inheritance if the disclaimer benefits a spouse or descendants.
- 4. <u>Purposes</u>: The Attorney-in-Fact shall exercise broad powers of management over the assets, liabilities, and business affairs of principal and do those things that are necessary or desirable

If protective proceedings are hereafter commenced, the principal nominates the Attorneyin-Fact as the guardian or limited guardian of the estate or person for consideration by the court.

- Effective Date: This Power of Attorney shall become effective upon the disability or incompetence of a principal. Disability shall include the inability to manage his or her property and affairs effectively for reasons such as mental illness, mental deficiency, physical illness or disability, advanced age, chronic use of drugs, chronic intoxication, confinement, or disappearance. Disability or incompetence may be evidenced by a written statement of a qualified physician regularly attending the principal or by other qualified persons with knowledge of any confinement or disappearance, as may be appropriate under the circumstances. Incompetence may be established by a finding of a court having jurisdiction over the incompetent principal.
- 6. Duration: This Durable Power of Attorney becomes effective as provided in paragraph 5 and shall remain in effect to the extent permitted by Title 11 RCW, as amended, until revoked or terminated under paragraph 7 or 8, notwithstanding any uncertainty as to whether the principal is dead or alive. This power of attorney shall not be affected by disability of the principal and shall otherwise continue in full force and effect until revoked or terminated as hereinafter provided.
- 7. Revocation by Spouse/principals: This Power of Attorney may be revoked, suspended, or terminated in writing by both spouse/principals or by either spouse/principal in writing to the other principal, if living, otherwise to the successor Attorney-in-Fact, and by recording the written instrument of revocation in the office of the county recorder or auditor. This Power of Attorney to a spouse is deemed to be revoked by any subsequent filing of a petition for dissolution of marriage or separation.

8. Termination:

- By Appointment of Guardian. The appointment of a guardian of the estate of the principal vests in the guardian with court approval the power to revoke, suspend, or terminate this Power of Attorney; provided, that any Attorney-in-Fact appointed by this Durable Power of Attorney is hereby nominated to serve as guardian of the person or estate of the disabled or incompetent principal if protective proceedings are hereafter commenced. The appointment of the guardian of the person only does not empower the guardian to revoke, suspend, or terminate this Power of Attorney.
- By Death of Principal: The death of a principal shall be deemed to revoke this Power of Attorney upon actual knowledge or actual notice being received by the Attorney-in-Fact.
- 9. Accounting: The Attorney-in-Fact shall be required to account to any subsequently appointed personal representative.

- 10. Reliance: The designated and acting Attorney-in-Fact and all persons dealing with the Attorney-in-Fact shall be entitled to rely upon this Power of Attorney so long as neither the Attorneyin-Fact, nor any person with whom he or she was dealing at the time of any act taken pursuant to this Power of Attorney, has received actual knowledge or actual notice of any revocation, suspension, or termination of the Power of Attorney, by death or otherwise. Any action so taken, unless otherwise invalid or unenforceable, shall be binding upon the heirs, devisees, legatees, or personal representatives of the principal.
- 11. Indemnity: The estate of the principal shall hold harmless and indemnify the Attorney-in-Fact from all liability for acts done in good faith and not in fraud of the principal.
- 12. Applicable Law. The laws of the State of Washington shall govern this Power of Attorney.
- 13. Execution: This Power of Attorney is signed in duplicate on this 2 2 day of October 2009, to become effective as provided in paragraph 5 of this document.
