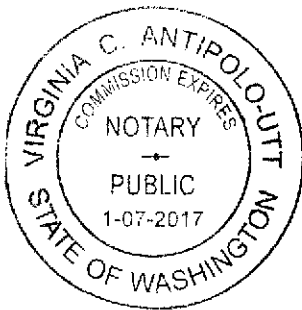

**Amended and Restated Living Trust Agreement of
Russell B. Sleipness and Sonja J. Sleipness**

This Amended and Restated Revocable Living Trust Agreement is made this 7th day of December, 2012 by and among RUSSELL B. SLEIPNESS and SONJA J. SLEIPNESS, husband and wife, Trustors ("Trustors" herein) and RUSSELL B. SLEIPNESS and SONJA J. SLEIPNESS, husband and wife, as co-Trustees ("Trustee" herein) of said Trust.

Recitals

- A. Trustors established this revocable trust by signing a written trust agreement dated November 13, 1991 and titled "The Russell B. Sleipness and Sonja J. Sleipness Revocable Living Trust Agreement" ("Original Trust Agreement").
- B. The Trustors signed several written amendments to the Original Trust Agreement.
- C. The Trustors want to amend and completely restate the Original Trust Agreement by means of this Amended and Restated Living Trust Agreement of Russell B. Sleipness and Sonja J. Sleipness ("Amended and Restated Trust Agreement").
- D. This Amended and Restated Trust Agreement shall supersede the Original Trust Agreement and all prior amendments of the Original Trust Agreement.

ACCORDINGLY, the Trustors and Trustee hereby amend and restate the Original Trust Agreement as follows.

**ARTICLE 1.
RECITALS**

The recitals shall be part of this trust agreement.

**ARTICLE 2.
FAMILY**

Trustors' immediate family consists of their children EVAN P. SLEIPNESS, OLE R. SLEIPNESS and KJELL S. SLEIPNESS, all of whom are adults. The Trustors have no other children living and have no children who have predeceased them. "Children" shall mean the Trustors' children named above. "Descendants" shall mean lawful lineal issue of every degree, provided an adopted person shall be treated as a descendant of a Trustor if such adoption occurred prior to the person's twenty-first (21st) birthday.

**ARTICLE 2.
THE TRUST ESTATE; NAME**

2.1 Trust Estate. Trustors have transferred certain real and personal property shown on Schedule A which is incorporated herein by this reference. The Trustee

acknowledges receipt of this property. This property which, together with any other property hereafter transferred to and accepted by the Trustee shall constitute the Trust Estate ("Trust Estate" herein) and shall be administered by the Trustee as provided in this agreement. Unless otherwise agreed by the Trustors in a writing acknowledged by the Trustors and notarized, the Trustors intend that all property transferred to the trust and whether or not listed on Schedule A is the community property of the Trustors and the Trustors intend and agree that such property shall be and remain community property.

2.2 Trust Name. This Trust shall be called the RUSSELL B. SLEIPNESS and SONJA J. SLEIPNESS REVOCABLE LIVING TRUST AMENDED AND RESTATED ON December 7, 2012 ("Trust").

2.3 Grantor Trust. During the joint lives of the Trustors, this trust shall be a grantor trust under Internal Revenue Code §676.

ARTICLE 3. REVOCATION; WITHDRAWAL OF PROPERTY; MODIFICATION

3.1 While Both Trustors Are Living. (a) Amendment or Modification of Trust Agreement; Community Property. While both Trustors are living they shall have the right acting jointly and either Trustor acting on behalf of the marital community shall have the right individually to revoke this Agreement in its entirety or to partially revoke or modify this Agreement with regard to community property which is part of the Trust Estate.

(b) Amendment or Modification of Trust Agreement; Separate Property. While a Trustor is living who has separate property which is part of the Trust Estate, such Trustor shall have the right acting individually to revoke this Agreement in its entirety or to partially revoke or modify this Agreement with regard the separate property of such Trustor which is part of the Trust Estate.

(c) Withdrawal of Trust Property; Additional Property. Either Trustor may at any time withdraw from the operation of the trust any part or all of said Trustor's separate property and revest ownership of such property in such Trustor. Both Trustors acting jointly may withdraw community property from the Trust Estate and revest such property in the Trustors as community property. Either Trustor may withdraw community property from the operation of the trust acting as agent for the marital community. Either or both Trustors may transfer to the Trustee additional property acceptable to the Trustee for administration as a part of the Trust Estate.

3.2 After Death of One Trustor. After the death of the first Trustor to die, the surviving Trustor, with respect to the Survivor's Trust provided for in Article 5.5, shall have the power to revoke the Survivor's Trust in its entirety, to partially revoke or modify the Survivor's Trust, to withdraw from the operation of the Survivor's Trust any part of the property of the Trust Estate and revest or vest ownership in the surviving Trustor, and to transfer to the Trustee additional property acceptable to the Trustee for administration as a part of the Survivor's Trust.

3.3 Effectiveness. Any revocation, withdrawal of property, or modification exercisable by one or both of the Trustors shall be valid and fully effective whenever the Trustee shall receive from either or both Trustors written notice exercising such right, except that the powers and duties of the Trustee shall not be changed without the Trustee's written consent. In the case of revocation or withdrawal of property, the

Trustee shall have a reasonable period of time to transfer or deliver the property.

3.4 Rights Personal to Trustors. The rights reserved herein to the Trustors or a Trustor are personal to the Trustors or Trustor and shall not be exercised by any other person, including an attorney-in-fact or a guardian of either Trustor's estate, unless exercised under a durable power of attorney specifically granting such authority or upon a court order.

ARTICLE 4.
BENEFICIARIES; PURPOSES;
DISTRIBUTIONS DURING TRUSTORS' LIFETIMES

4.1 Beneficiaries, Purposes. While both Trustors are living, the Trustors shall be the sole beneficiaries of the Trust Estate and the purpose of the trust shall be to provide for the Trustors as either or both of them may direct and desire.

4.2 Distributions While Both Trustors Are Living. As long as both Trustors are living, the Trustee shall make such distributions of income and principal to the Trustors as either or both of the Trustors shall direct regardless of whether the income or principal is community property or separate property. If both Trustors are incapacitated, the successor trustee, in such Trustee's sole discretion, may discontinue in whole or in part payments heretofore directed. Such successor trustee, in the Trustee's sole discretion shall use and pay so much of either income and/or principal from community property or separate property of the trust estate as the Trustee deems necessary for the health, maintenance, support, comfort or happiness of the Trustors, or either of them, or for the payment of any legal obligations of the Trustors and for the preservation of the Trust Estate including any property of either or both Trustors and for any other benefit to the either or both Trustors.

ARTICLE 5.
DISTRIBUTIONS AFTER THE DEATH OF ONE TRUSTOR OR BOTH TRUSTORS

5.1 Death of Both Trustors. If the Trustors die simultaneously or if neither Trustor survives the other by thirty (30) days, then the Trustee shall first divide the Trust Estate into two shares. Each share shall contain each deceased Trustor's community property interest in the Trust Estate and any interest in separate property which is part of the Trust Estate. Thereafter each share shall be distributed to the Trustors' children in equal shares. The share of any child who does not survive the death of both Trustors, but who leaves descendants surviving him, shall be distributed to such descendants by right of representation.

5.2 Death of One Trustor.

(a) Initial Allocation. At the death of the first Trustor with the other Trustor surviving by thirty (30) days, the Trustee shall, as above, first divide the Trust Estate into two shares. One share shall include the Decedent Trustor's community property interest and separate property interests in the Trust Estate ("Decedent Trustor's Share") and the other share shall include the surviving Trustor's community property interest and separate property interests in the Trust Estate ("Surviving Trustor's Share").

(b) Allocation of Decedent Trustor's Share and the Surviving Trustor's Share. The Decedent Trustor's Share shall be allocated to the Decedent's Trust

to be held, administered and distributed as provided in Article 5.3. The Surviving Trustor's Share shall be allocated to the Survivor's Trust to be held and administered as provided for in Article 5.4.

(c) Each share created in this Article 5.2 shall be a separate trust to be held, administered and distributed as provided for below with respect to such share.

5.3 Decedent's Trust.

(a) The Decedent's Trust shall consist of the Decedent Trustor's Share allocated in Article 5.2.

(b) Beneficiary; Purposes. The surviving Trustor shall be the sole beneficiary of the Decedent's Trust during the surviving Trustor's lifetime and its purposes with respect to the surviving Trustor shall be to provide funds for the surviving Trustor's health, support and maintenance.

(c) Distributions of Income. As long as the surviving Trustor is living, the Trustee shall pay all income of the Decedent's Trust estate to the surviving Trustor, preferably monthly, but in no event less frequently than quarterly. The income payable to the surviving Trustor shall be calculated from the date of the death of the first Trustor and shall continue so long as the surviving Trustor shall live. If the surviving Trustor's death occurs within an income paying period, the proportionate part of the total income for such final period calculated to the date of the surviving Trustor's death, as well as all other income of the Decedent's Trust, accrued and undistributed to said date, shall be the surviving Trustor's property and shall be distributed to the estate of the surviving Trustor.

(d) Distributions of Principal. If at any time the income distributions to the surviving Trustor are inadequate for accomplishing the purposes of the Trust, the Trustee shall distribute principal to accomplish such purposes.

(e) Other Powers of Surviving Trustor. Notwithstanding any other provision herein to the contrary, to the extent the surviving Trustor directs in writing, the Trustee shall convert nonincome-producing assets of this Trust to income producing assets.

(f) Disposition of Decedent's Trust Estate Upon Death of the Surviving Trustor. Upon the death of the surviving Trustor, the Trustee shall pay from the portion of this trust for which an election under §2056(b)(7) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, ("Code" herein) applies or for which a similar election under Washington estate tax law and related regulations applies that portion of the federal or state estate tax or similar taxes imposed under applicable law, and any interest or penalties imposed thereon, on that portion of the trust includable in the surviving Trustor's estate by reason of §2044 of the Code or includable for Washington estate tax purposes under Washington estate tax law because a deduction was allowed in the estate of the first Trustor to die. Thereafter, the balance of assets in this trust shall be distributed in equal shares to the Trustors' children who survive the termination of the Decedent's Trust. The share of any child who does to survive the termination of the Decedent's Trust, but who leaves descendants surviving him or her shall be distributed to such descendants by right of representation.

(g) Marital Deduction Intent. With regard to any portion of this trust for which an election has been made under §2056(b)(7) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 as amended, or for which an election has been made under Washington estate tax

law by the Trustee or the personal representative of the first Trustor to die; if the granting of any right, power, privilege, authority, or immunity to the Trustee, or any other person; or the imposition of any duty upon the Trustee, or any other person; by any provision of this instrument would disqualify any share or interest of a beneficiary hereunder from qualifying for the marital deduction provided by Section 2056 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended from time to time, or under Washington estate tax law such provision shall be ineffective if and to the extent that the same, if effective, would so disqualify such share or interest from such deduction. In this respect the Trustors intend that the provisions of RCW 11.108 and other applicable law shall apply, and any provision of this instrument which would otherwise disqualify property passing to this trust shall be subordinate to this intent.

(h) Irrevocability. The Decedent's Trust shall be irrevocable at the death of the first Trustor to die.

5.4. Survivor's Trust; Beneficiary; Purpose. The surviving Trustor shall be the sole beneficiary of the Survivor's Trust for such Trustor's lifetime and the purposes of this trust shall be to provide for the surviving Trustor as the surviving Trustor directs.

(a) Distributions During Life of Surviving Trustor. As long as the surviving Trustor lives, the Trustee shall make such distributions of income and principal to or for the benefit of the surviving Trustor as the surviving Trustor shall direct. If the surviving Trustor becomes disabled or incompetent the successor trustee, in such Trustee's sole discretion, may discontinue in whole or in part payments heretofore directed. The successor trustee, in the Trustee's sole discretion, may at any time use and pay so much of either income and/or principal of the trust estate as the Trustee deems necessary for the health, maintenance, support and comfort of the surviving Trustor, or for the payment of any legal obligations of the surviving Trustor, and for the preservation of the Trust Estate of the Survivor's Trust or any property of the surviving Trustor and for any other benefit to the surviving Trustor.

(b) Distributions at the Death of the Surviving Trustor. At the death of the surviving Trustor, the balance of the Survivor's Trust shall be distributed in equal shares to the Trustors' children. The share of any child who does not survive the termination of the Survivor's Trust, but who leaves descendants surviving him or her shall be distributed to such descendants by right of representation.

ARTICLE 6. POWERS AND DUTIES OF TRUSTEE

6.1 General. The Trustee shall have full power to sell, dispose of, invest, reinvest, exchange and manage the assets of the trust estate and shall have all of the powers incident to trustees as provided by Washington State law, as amended from time to time, except insofar as it may be inconsistent with other express provisions of this instrument, which provisions shall control.

6.2 Determination of Principal and Income. The Trustee shall not be required to make any adjustments in bookkeeping as between the income and principal accounts in connection with premiums paid or discounts received on securities purchased. Trustee is authorized to credit or to charge premiums or discounts on investments, and any scrip, stock dividends, extraordinary dividends or other receipts, and any estate or inheritance or other taxes or charges, either to or against principal or income, as in the Trustee's discretion shall seem reasonable, just, proper and consistent with the purpose of the trust

under the circumstances. Income which by exercise of Trustee's discretion is not distributed to beneficiaries shall be added to the principal of the trust from which it was derived not less frequently than annually. Trustee shall not be required to establish a reserve for depreciation. Except as specifically otherwise provided in this Article 6.2, the Trustee, and any trust established under this Trust shall be subject to the provisions of the Washington Principal and Income Act of 2002 (RCW Chapter 11.104A). Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Trustee shall have the power to allocate expenses, costs and expenditures related to the administration of my estate, including, but not limited to, attorney's fees, accountant's fees, appraiser's fees, court costs, interest, penalties, taxes and other administrative costs or expenses, between income and principal, after taking into account the tax consequences of such allocations. The discretion granted pursuant to this Article 6.2 shall be subject to the fiduciary duties otherwise imposed by law and no such powers shall be exercised in such a way as to prevent property passing to or for the benefit of a surviving Trustor from qualifying for the marital deduction under Section 2056 of the Code or under Washington estate tax law.

6.3 Distributions to Beneficiaries. The Trustee may make non-pro rata distributions in kind and may make distributions and satisfy bequests as otherwise provided by law and in doing so may, but shall not be required to, consider the basis of trust assets for income tax purposes and the tax brackets of beneficiaries. Unless otherwise provided in this Trust, during the minority or disability of any beneficiary, distributions of income and principal to the beneficiary may be made directly to the beneficiary, to his or her natural or legal guardian or to any relative of the beneficiary to be expended for the beneficiary's benefit. Unless otherwise provided in this Trust, distributions for a beneficiary under the age of twenty-one (21) may be made to a "Custodian under the Washington Uniform Transfers to Minors Act," as selected by Trustee. The Trustee shall not be required to see to the application of payments so made and the receipt of any such person therefor shall be a full discharge for the Trustee.

6.4 Protection From Creditors. No share or interest of a beneficiary shall be subject to assignment, alienation, pledge, attachment or claims of creditors.

6.5 Annual Accounting. The Trustee shall submit to any beneficiary entitled to current distributions of trust income or principal at reasonable periods as requested, but not more frequently than annually, statements showing the true condition of each trust estate of which such person is a beneficiary. The books and records pertaining to such trust shall be open to the beneficiary or beneficiaries at all times during business hours. The Trustee is relieved from all of the duties which would otherwise be placed upon the Trustee by the act relating to accounting by trustees in force in the state of Washington at the time this instrument is executed, or any amendment or amendments thereto, or by any similar laws, act or acts of the same or any other state or jurisdiction. Provided, however, so long as either Trustor is acting as trustee no accountings need be made to any person.

6.6 Pooling of Trusts. The Trustee need not segregate and may combine the assets of the separate trusts established by this Trust for the purpose of administration. In the event this is done, the Trustee shall maintain books of account so the interest of each beneficiary in each trust is readily ascertainable.

6.7 Merger with Similar Trusts; Division of Trusts. If at any time there are two or more trusts under this Trust or any other instrument which are to fulfill substantially similar purposes for the same beneficiary or beneficiaries, any two or more of such trusts may, in the discretion of the trustees of such trusts, be merged or consolidated if the probable effect of such merger or consolidation trust not be to the

substantial disadvantage of such beneficiary or beneficiaries. If the trustees of the trusts are not the same persons, they shall serve as co-trustees of the merged or consolidated trusts, unless it is agreed by such trustees that only one of them should serve as trustee. Similarly, the Trustee shall have the discretionary power to subdivide separate or separable shares of a single trust into separate trusts. These powers to combine and divide trusts may be exercised from time to time, and may be used to modify or reverse their prior exercise. In deciding whether and how to exercise this authority, the Trustee may (but need not) take into account efficiencies of administration, taxes and any other considerations the Trustee may deem appropriate to these decisions.

6.8 Prevention of Perpetuities. Notwithstanding any term or provision in this Trust seemingly to the contrary, each trust established hereunder which has not terminated at some earlier date, shall, in any event, terminate one day earlier than 150 years after the effective date of each such trust and the Trustee shall thereupon distribute all remaining assets of each such trust to the beneficiary or beneficiaries in accordance with their interests at that time.

6.9 Administration of Residential Property. The Trustee may retain or purchase any residential property and maintain it at the expense of the trust as long as the Trustee deems it practicable to do so in furtherance of the trust purposes. Whatever homes (including winter or summer recreational residences and any condominium units for personal use) in which the trust holds an interest at the time of the first Trustor's death shall be available for the use of the surviving Trustor rent free, as long as the surviving Trustor so desires. The Trustee shall maintain such homes at the expense of the trust, including payment of taxes and assessments. Such homes shall not be sold without the surviving Trustor's consent, or, in the event of the surviving Trustor's incapacity, the consent of the surviving Trustor's legal guardian or attorney-in-fact under a durable power of attorney.

ARTICLE 7 SUCCESSOR TRUSTEES; APPLICABLE LAW; ADMINISTRATION

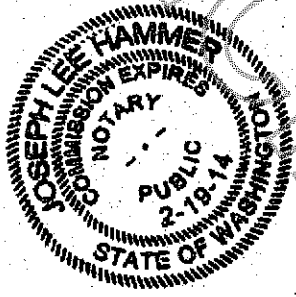
7.1 Successor Trustee. If at any time either of the original Trustees declines, fails, resigns or for any reason is unable to act as Trustee, the remaining Trustee shall serve as sole Trustee. In the event both original Trustees decline, fail, resign or for any reason are unable to act as Trustee, the Trustors appoint the Trustors' son OLE R. SLEIPNESS as Trustee. In the event OLE R. SLEIPNESS declines, fails, resigns or for any other reason is unable to act as Trustee, then EVAN P. SLEIPNESS shall act as successor Trustee. In the event EVAN P. SLEIPNESS declines, fails, resigns or for any other reason is unable to act as Trustee, then KJELL S. SLEIPNESS shall act as successor Trustee. The Trustee may resign without approval of the court upon providing an accounting of trust assets in a manner satisfactory to the successor trustee as indicated by the written acceptance of trust assets and approval of such accounting by the successor trustee. Appointment of a successor trustee as provided herein shall not require court approval. The Trustee shall not be required to post any bond.

7.2 Disability of Trustees. Disability or incapacity, making a Trustor-Trustee incapable of effectively serving in that office shall be evidenced by either a judgment or decree of a court of competent jurisdiction, or by written statements made by two licensed physicians. Following such judgment or certification of incapacity or disability, the disabled trustee shall cease to act as trustee until such time as either a court of competent jurisdiction by judgment or two licensed physicians determine that the Trustor-Trustee is competent to serve as Trustee. After a redetermination of competency,

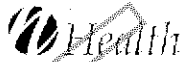

2. The name(s) must match exactly the asserted true name. For example, if the affidavit says the name is Mary Ann Doe, then the birth certificate must be Mary Ann Doe. Mary A. Doe or M. A. Doe does not prove the name is Mary Ann Doe.
3. **Child under 18**
• Only parent(s) or legal guardian can change the birth certificate.
• Guardian must submit certified court order giving them authority to act on behalf of child(ren).
• Up to age one, the last name of the child can be changed once, to the mother's maiden name, father's name (if present on the certificate) or any combination of the two. After age one a court ordered legal name change is required.
• Parent(s) may change the child's first or middle name by completing this affidavit of correction. No proof is needed.
• To correct parent's information, one documentary proof is required. Proof must be five (or more) years old or have been established within five years of birth.
4. **This affidavit cannot be used to add a father to a birth certificate.** (See the uniform child support guidelines, Title 26, Chapter 26.03, RCW)

Death Certificates
1. Only the informant, the funeral director, or coroner/administrator of the county where the death occurred may request a change. Proof is required to make changes if requested by someone other than the informant. Proof is required if the informant is someone other than the informant requesting the change.
2. The medical information (cause of death) may be changed only by the certifying physician or the coroner/medical examiner.
3. If it is less than sixty days from date of death please contact the county health department where the death occurred to make changes.

Marriage/Dissolution (Divorce) Certificates
1. Personal fact(s) (minor spelling changes in name, date, or place of birth or residence) may be changed by affidavit (with proof of marriage or dissolution).
2. To change the date or place of marriage or dissolution, the officiant (minister or clerk of court (dissolution)) must sign the affidavit.
