COMMUNITY PROPERTY AGREEMENT

Agreement made this 13th day of June, 2022, between THOMAS R. DEACH JR. ("Husband") and CAROL ANN DEACH ("Wife"), husband and wife, both of whom are domiciled in the state of Washington. In consideration of their mutual agreements set forth below, the parties agree as follows:

1. Property Covered

Except as provided below, this Agreement shall apply to all community and separate property now owned or hereafter acquired by Husband and Wife or either of them (except for community property (a) for which a separate beneficiary designation has been or is hereafter made by Husband or Wife and approved by the other spouse or (b) for which a separate beneficiary designation has been or is hereafter made by the Husband or Wife and for which no consent by the other spouse is legally required) even though some items may have been or may be purchased or acquired by one or the other or both or may have been or may be registered in the name of one or the other or both.

All such property is declared to be community property of Husband and Wife and is referred to in this Agreement as the "described community property." Each hereby conveys and quitclaims to the other his or her interest in any separate property he or she may now own or hereafter acquire so as to convert same into the described community property.

2. Vesting at Death of a Spouse

If Husband dies and Wife survives him, all of the described community property shall vest in Wife as of the moment of Husband's death. If Wife dies and Husband survives her, all of the described community property shall vest in Husband as of the moment of Wife's death.

3. Disclaimer

Upon the death of either spouse, the surviving spouse may disclaim any interest passing under this Agreement in whole or in part, or with reference to specific parts, shares or assets thereof, in which event the interest disclaimed shall pass as if the provisions of

Paragraph 2 had been revoked as to such interest with the surviving spouse entitled to the benefits provided by any alternative disposition.

4. Automatic Revocation

The provisions of Paragraph 2 shall be automatically revoked:

- a. Upon the filing by either party of a petition, complaint or other pleading for separation, dissolution or divorce; or
- b. Upon the establishment of a domicile out of the state of Washington by either party; or
- c. Immediately prior to death, if the order of death cannot be ascertained.

5. Revocation of Inconsistent Agreements

To the extent this Agreement is inconsistent with any provisions of any community property agreement or other arrangement previously made by the parties that affects the described community property, the terms of this Agreement shall be deemed to revoke such prior provisions to the extent of the inconsistency.
