The appellant cites, I have done zero improvements to my house in over 5 years. I would like the assessor to explain to me how it is that my house has increased in value, not the land. I would like documentation as to why my house only has increased in value.

The Assessor, represented by Deputy Assessor Brian Herring and Doug Webb, did not provide a response because there was no evidence provided by the petitioner.

The burden of proof is on the petitioner to provide clear, cogent, and convincing evidence to support the appeal. In this case, the petitioner did not submit sufficient evidence to support a reduction. Therefore, the Board finds that the petitioner has failed to overcome the evidentiary standard necessary to overrule the assessor.

Upon motion duly made and seconded, the Board unanimously upholds the Assessor.
