The petitioner was not present at the April 17, 2025, hearing.

This property is described as vacant land situation on 7.4 acres located on Bow Hill Road, Bow, Skagit County, Washington. The appellant cites, no improvements have been made to the property. Parcel next door has not been able to sell. 75% of the acreage is not usable. An environmental survey is needed to build and will cost \$6,000. Water is a very expensive challenge here. Deep wells and no public water. The overwhelming challenges in attempting to use and improve land negate the assessed value.

The Assessor, represented by Deputy Assessor Brian Herring and Doug Webb, provided an oral testimony noting that the property assessment has multiple downward adjustments, including a bare land adjustment of 10%, an additional 30% for development challenges, and a 60% adjustment due to a 2023 appeal resulting in a stipulation. The Assessor requests the board sustain the current valuation.


BOE members present were Rich Holtrop, Angie Bossarte, and Betta Spinelli.

The burden of proof is on the petitioner to provide clear, cogent, and convincing evidence to support the appeal. In this case, the petitioner did not submit sufficient evidence to support a reduction. Therefore, the Board finds that the petitioner has failed to overcome the evidentiary standard necessary to overrule the assessor.

Upon motion duly made and seconded, the Board unanimously upholds the Assessor.
