The petitioner was not present at the April 24, 2025, hearing.

This property is described as a vacant land parcel of 4.56 acres, contiguous with the residential property located at 28601 South Skagit Highway, Sedro Woolley, Skagit County, Washington. The appellant cites, wet portion of land is underwater 7 months out of the year. 75 ft lower than other (all) properties in the area.

The Assessor, represented by Deputy Assessor Brian Herring and Doug Webb, provided an oral testimony in response to the petition. They testified that this property has received downward adjustments to address flooding issues and therefore request that the Board sustain the current valuation.

BOE members present were Rich Holtrop, Angie Bossarte, and Betta Spinelli.

The burden of proof is on the petitioner to provide clear, cogent, and convincing evidence to support the appeal. The Skagit County Assessor has already applied discounts to this property that are in place. In this case, the petitioner did not submit sufficient evidence to support a further reduction. Therefore, the Board finds that the petitioner has failed to overcome the evidentiary standard necessary to overrule the assessor.

Upon motion duly made and seconded, the Board unanimously upholds the Assessor.
