

Situation Status Update

- 4,312 positive cases (PCR confirmed)
- 346 Probable cases
- 274 Hospitalizations
- 63 Deaths
- Case rate: 132.4 cases per 100k over last 14 days

Roadmap to Recovery Changes

- Currently in Phase 3 of Roadmap to Recovery
- On March 11, Governor Inslee altered Roadmap to Recovery again. Changes include:
 - Counties evaluated individually, rather than by region
 - Using two metrics, rather than four, to evaluate progress:
 - Case Rate Per 100k over 14 days
 - COVID-19 Hospitalization's average over five days (per County)
 - Additionally, if ICU occupancy gets to 90 percent full or over Statewide, all counties will automatically go back one phase








Vaccines Overview

- 58,381 vaccine doses administered in the County so far. Includes:
 - 35,769 people initiating vaccination
 - 21,364 people fully vaccinated
 - Per DOH, roughly 16% of population fully vaccinated


Skagit County % of population that has received 1 dose of vaccine = 27.68% Washington State = 24.16%




COVID-19 IN WASHINGTON STATE People Initiating Vaccination (Receiving at least 1 dose)

This chart shows the number of people in Washington initiating vaccination (receiving at least 1 dose). People initiating vaccination represent the total number of people who have received at least one dose of any type of COVID-19 vaccine. Individuals who are fully vaccinated are included in the count of both People Initiating Vaccination and People Fully Vaccinated. Please note, the measures "vaccines given" and "people vaccinated" are not comparable. Vaccines given counts number of doses given in a location. People vaccinated counts number of Washington residents initiating vaccination and

County data for people initiating vaccination are based on the vaccine recipient's county of residence. 63,862 people initiating vaccination do not have a county reported. For 245 people who initiated vaccination, we are unable to determine whether all

HOW ARE VACCINE ALLOCATIONS DETERMINED?

- New process as of 3/23/2021
- Federal Government provides state with 3 week allocation information and sets state vaccine allocation week by week
- State informs Local Health Jurisdictions (LHJ) of 3 week vaccine allocation information for each county on Wednesday of each week. This can change.
- Providers place their vaccine orders into the state vaccine database between noon Friday and noon Monday each week.
- LHJ provides feedback to on allocations to their county of jurisdiction keeping to the total amount in the vaccine allocation for the county.
- State finalized vaccine orders on the Friday following the order weekend.
- Approved orders are shipped following Monday use within 7 days.

Providers are required to vaccinate by phases defined by the Governor: www.findyourphasewa.org

We are currently in Phase 1B tier 2 of vaccine distribution

- High-risk critical workers* in the following industries: agriculture, fishing vessel crews, food processing, grocery store/food bank, corrections (prisons, jails, detention centers), court of law, public transit, and remaining first responders
- People 16 years or older who are pregnant or have a disability that puts them at high risk for severe COVID-19 illness
- Anyone 65 and older
- · All people 50 and older who also live in a multigenerational household
- · All workers at risk in health care settings
- Educators and school staff for pre-kindergarten through 12th grade, and child care workers
- People who live or work in long-term care facilities

*Work in an enclosed space around other people and cannot maintain physical distance.




Three vaccines provided in United States under **Emergency Use Authorization:**

- Pfizer BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine 2 dose
- Moderna COVID-19 Vaccine 2 dose
- Johnson & Johnson Janssen COVID-19 Vaccine – 1 Dose

All three are extremely effective at preventing serious illness and death from COVID-19

All three are shown to be safe






Skagit County Fairgrounds Vaccine Site








COVID-19 in 2020: Cases, Hospitalizations & Deaths by Age







This report seeks to provide an empirical overview of Skagit County Public Health and Unified Command's COVID-19 response. The first case of COVID-19 in the United States was found in Everett, Washington on February 21, 2020 and the first case of COVID-19 in Skagit County was confirmed on March 10, 2020. This report therefore covers the first full year of active COVID-19 response in Skagit
