Cooperative Services Agreement No. 18-7353-2009-RA Work Plan/Financial Plan with the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA), Animal and Plant Health Inspection Services (APHIS) Wildlife Services (WS) to provide assistance to Skagit County in reducing damage caused by European starlings, blackbirds, cowbirds, and pigeons. - 6. Local Agency A&E Professional Services Consultant Agreement with Natural Systems Design, Inc. for the Concrete-Sauk Valley Road Bank Stabilization and Fish Passage Project, #ES08000-10. Natural Systems Design will provide a study to identify and evaluate restoration alternatives that restore and protect the roadway as well as resolve the perched culverts and related fish passage concerns within the project area. The project is located at milepost 13.2 on Concrete-Sauk Valley Road, southeast of the Town of Concrete. Compensation shall not exceed \$224,350. The Agreement shall commence on the date of mutual acceptance and continue for one year from the date of execution.

Agreement for Grant Sub-Award with Puget Sound Restoration Fund (Sub-award Recipient), for Sub-award Recipient to provide services to the County for tasks pertaining to Task 5 Pinto Abalone Recovery under the Washington State Department of Ecology (DOE) Grant SEANWS-2017-SkCoPW-00002 (Skagit County Contract No. C20170481) for the operations and projects of the Skagit County Marine Resources Committee (MRC). Compensation to Sub-award Recipient for completed work and services shall not exceed \$18,500. The Agreement is ratified to commence on October 1, 2017, and continue through September 30, 2018.

- 8. Personal Services Agreement with USI Insurance Services National, Inc., to provide benefit brokerage services.
