IV. CONSENT AGENDA FOR MONDAY, JANUARY 14, 2019 (items 1 through 14):

a) **COMMISSIONERS:**

- 1. Record of the Proceedings for Monday, January 7, 2019.
- 2. Resolution approving the appointment of a replacement Commissioner for Skagit County Drainage and Irrigation Improvement District No. 19 due to the resignation of Drainage Commissioner Henry Vander Veen, Position 2, which was effective on December 31, 2018. Steve Larson shall be appointed to the Skagit County Drainage and Irrigation Improvement District No.19 to fill out the remaining term of Henry Vander Veen, subject to further filing and election as required by the Skagit County Auditor's Office.
- 3. Resolution appointing Justin Hayton to the Agricultural Advisory Board, representing Commissioner District 2. Mr. Hayton shall be appointed for a three-year term, which will end on December 31, 2021.

b) EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES:

- 4. Resolution authorizing the transfer of surplus equipment consisting of eight (8) Zoll AED Pros and four (4) Microsoft Surface Pros to the Sedro-Woolley Fire Department.
- 5. Resolution authorizing the transfer of surplus equipment consisting of six (6) Zoll AED Pros to the Anacortes Fire Department.
- 6. Resolution authorizing the transfer of surplus equipment consisting of twelve (12) Zoll AED Pros, two (2) Microsoft Surface Pros, one (1) ZOLL LifePak 12 Defib Device and one (1) 2006 Ford Expedition to the Mount Vernon Fire Department.
- 7. Resolution authorizing the transfer of surplus equipment consisting of four (4) Zoll AED Pros and two (2) Microsoft Surface Pros to the Burlington Fire Department.
- 8. Interlocal Cooperative Agreement with Fire District No. 13 (District) to provide trauma verified ambulance services on a twenty-four (24) hours per day, seven (7) days per week basis, with appropriate ambulances and equipment in accordance with Washington Administrative Code (WAC) 246-976, North Region EMS and Trauma Care Council, and other applicable laws, regulations, ordinances and established policies of the Skagit County Medical Program Director when authorized by state law. The District shall bill Skagit County on a monthly basis. Total compensation for the entire term of the Agreement shall not exceed \$100,000 for 2021; \$109,273 for 2022; \$112,551 for 2023, and \$115,927 for 2024 for a total amount not exceed \$646,841. The Agreement is ratified to commence on January 1, 2019, and continue until December 31, 2024.

c) <u>PUBLIC DEFENDER:</u>

- 9. Personal Services Agreement with Susan Goolsbee, Law Office of Susan Goolsbee, PLLC, to provide legal defense services to defendants who qualify as indigent and who are charged with offenses in Skagit County District Court. The contractor will be assigned a maximum of thirty-three (33) District Court cases per month, to be assigned at the discretion of the Skagit County Public Defender's office. These cases may include criminal and probation violation cases. In addition, the Contractor will handle every sixth out-of-custody District Court DUI arraignment calendar and every sixth out-of-custody non-DUI arraignment calendar. Annual compensation is based on a fee schedule and shall not exceed \$96,000 for a total compensation not to exceed \$192,000 for the entire term of the contract. The Agreement is ratified to commence on January 1, 2019, and continue until December 31, 2020.
- 10. Personal Services Agreement with Geoff McCann, McCann & McCann, PLLC, to provide legal defense services to defendants who qualify as indigent and who are charged with offenses in Skagit County District Court. The contractor will be assigned a maximum of thirty-three (33) District Court cases per month, to be assigned at the discretion of the Skagit County Public Defender's office. These cases may include criminal and probation violation cases. In addition, the Contractor will handle every fifth out-of-custody District Court DUI arraignment calendar and every fifth out-of-custody non-DUI arraignment calendar. Annual compensation is based on a fee schedule and shall not exceed \$96,000 for a total compensation amount not to exceed \$192,000 for the entire term of the contract. The Agreement is ratified to commence on January 1, 2019, and continue until December 31, 2020.
- 11. Personal Services Agreement with Shauna Snyder dba Skepteon Investigations to provide investigation services as requested by the Skagit County Public Defender, including, but not limited to, witness interviews, preparation of witness interview reports or transcriptions, locating witnesses, service of subpoenas, and preparation of diagrams, photographing items of evidentiary value, obtaining records, and court testimony. The services provided shall include adult and juvenile cases. Annual compensation is based on a fee schedule and shall not exceed \$96,000 for a total compensation amount not to exceed \$192,000 for the entire term of the Agreement. The Agreement shall commence on January 1, 2019, and continue until December 31, 2020.

d) <u>PUBLIC HEALTH:</u>

12. Agreement with the Washington State Association of Local Public Health Officials (WSALPHO) regarding the operation of Medicaid Administrative Claiming in Washington State. This Agreement facilitates the operation of Random Moment Time Survey in order to comply with requirements of the Cost Allocation Plan approved by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services and the contract between the Health Care Authority. This Agreement will also assist in oversight activities of the Health Care Authority to work with the Medicaid Administrative Steering Committee to provide coordination and program compliance among participating Local Health Jurisdictions. Compensation to (WSALPHO) shall not exceed \$17,000. The Agreement is ratified to commence on January 1, 2019, and continue until December 31, 2019.

e) <u>RISK MANAGEMENT:</u>

13. Personal Services Agreement with Summit Law Group, PLLC, to provide representation and assistance on matters related to employment law, labor relations/negotiations and litigation. Summit Law will also provide Human Resources/Risk Management training as requested by the Human Resources/Risk Management Director or appointed designee. Compensation shall not exceed \$75,000 and is based on a fee schedule. The Agreement shall commence on the date of execution and continue until December 31, 2019.

f) <u>TREASURER:</u>
