Compensation shall not exceed \$80,000 and is based on a fee schedule. The Agreement is being ratified to commence on December 1, 2017, and continue until December 31, 2018.

#### d) INFORMATION SERVICES:

7. Resolution calling for Requests for Proposal for a Public Health Strategy Management System for strategic planning in collaboration with the community.

## e) PUBLIC HEALTH:

- 8. Personal Services Agreement with NAMI Skagit to provide education and outreach to eligible individuals living with mental illness. Compensation is funded through Millage funds and shall not exceed \$15,000 which is based on a reimbursement for service fee schedule as outlined in Exhibit "B". The Agreement is being ratified to commence on January 1, 2018, and continue until December 31, 2018.
- 9. Personal Services Agreement with SeaMar Behavioral Health to provide outpatient substance use disorder support services to Skagit County residents who do not have benefits such as Medicaid or other public benefits or health insurance benefits. Compensation is based on a fee schedule, shall not exceed \$85,000, and is funded through the 1/10th of 1% chemical dependency or mental health treatment sales tax. The Agreement is being ratified to commence on January 1, 2018, and continues until December 31, 2018.
- 10. Personal Services Agreement with Pioneer Human Services to provide the services and staff for the Residential Substance Abuse Treatment (RSAT) Program for inmates of the Skagit County Community Justice Center. Compensation is based on a reimbursement for service fee schedule as outlined in Exhibit "C" and shall not exceed \$120,000. The Agreement is being ratified to commence on January 1, 2018, and continue until June 30, 2018.
- 11. Personal Services Agreement with Pioneer Human Services to provide one (1) full time employee (FTE) Case Manager to provide intensive case management services to individuals referred and/or enrolled in the Supportive Housing Program (SHP) and Tenant Based Rental Assistance (TBRA) Program through Community Action of Skagit County with the goal of helping them overcome barriers to engagement in housing and behavioral health treatment services. Compensation is based on a reimbursement for service fee schedule as outlined in Exhibit "C", shall not exceed \$30,500, and is funded by housing funds. The Agreement is being ratified to commence on January 1, 2018, and continue until June 30, 2018.

### f) PUBLIC WORKS:

12. Resolution to call for bids for two (2) new model four axle dump trucks for use by the Road Operations Division of the Public Works Department. The bid opening is schedule to take place on Monday, February 12, 2018, at 2:30 p.m. or as soon thereafter as possible in the Skagit County Commissioners' Hearing Room.

13. Local Agency Professional Services Consultant Agreement with Element Solutions to provide management and administration of flood, stormwater, and drainage projects. Compensation is based on a fee schedule and shall not exceed \$200,000. The Agreement shall commence on the date of mutual execution and end on December 31, 2020.

# g) SHERIFF:

Purchased Services Agreement with the Humane Society of Skagit Valley to provide kennels for animals on a seven (7) day per week basis for care and feeding of all animals brought in by County representatives. Compensation is based on a fee schedule and shall not exceed \$60,000. The Agreement is being ratified to commence on January 1, 2018, and continue until December 31, 2018.
