Amendment No. 1 to Personal Services Agreement No. C20200148 with Glosten, Inc. to provide as-needed Naval Architectural and Marine Engineering Services for the Ferry Division of Public Works on non-federally funded projects. This Amendment extends the term by one (1) year from March 31, 2022 to March 31, 2023. Compensation remains the same and shall not exceed \$250,000.
