The Amendment corrects an omission of provisions regarding Appendix A. The term of the Agreement remains the same and shall continue through December 31, 2024.

8. Subscription Agreement with West Publishing Corporation, A Thomson Reuters business, for West Proflex Legal Research for Prosecuting Attorney Office and Public Defender's Office. Compensation is based on fee schedule and shall not exceed \$83,000. The Agreement shall commence on the date of execution and will continue for three (3) years.

e) PARKS, RECREATION AND FAIR:

9. Vendor Services Agreement with Banner Electric Inc., dba Banner Power Solutions to install a solar system for the Veterans Plaza at Northern State Recreation Area. Compensation shall not exceed \$32,000. The Agreement shall commence on the date of execution and continue for two (2) years.

f) PROSECUTING ATTORNEY:

- 10. Second Assignment of Commercial Lease, Contract No. C20190127, for the Prosecuting Attorney's Office, Family Support Division to lease office space located at 1404 East College Way, Suite 101 in Mount Vernon. This Amendment assigns the lease from Norm Nelson and Jim Nelson to 1404 E. College Way LLC c/o Smiley Management Services. The term of the lease remains the same and continue until May 15, 2023. Lease payments will remain the same and shall not exceed \$2,787 per month. A second 2-year renewal option remains in place. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement and prior Amendment shall remain in effect.
- 11. Amendment No. 2 to Personal Services Agreement No. C20200739 with Janet Williamson to provide transcription services for victim, witness, and/or defendant interviews and depositions. This Amendment extends the term of the Agreement from December 31, 2022 to December 31, 2023. Compensation remains the same and shall not exceed \$10,000. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement and prior Amendment shall remain in effect.

g) PUBLIC DEFENDER:

12. Personal Services Agreement with Tatiana Dillard dba Whatcom County Investigation to provide investigation services as requested by the Skagit County Public Defender. Investigation services include, but are not limited to, witness interviews, preparation of witness interview reports or transcripts, locating witnesses, service of subpoenas, preparation of diagrams, photographing items of evidentiary value, obtaining records, and court testimony. Total compensation for the two-year term of the Agreement is based on a fee schedule and shall not exceed \$195,000. The Agreement is ratified to commence on January 1, 2023 and continue until December 31, 2024.

h) PUBLIC HEALTH:

- 13. Personal Services Agreement with Skagit Legal Aid to provide homelessness prevention support to households who are most at risk of homelessness. Compensation is based on a fee schedule and shall not exceed \$64,500. The Agreement is ratified to commence on January 1, 2023 and continue until June 30, 2023.
- 14. Resolution declaring a sole source purchase of Julota Care Management Software and waiving the competitive bidding procedures outlined in RCW 36.32.245, Resolution No. 15344, and Resolution No. R20210275. Julota software is the only solution that is feasible to implement Skagit County's Co-Responder Program that teams a mental health professional with law enforcement across multiple jurisdictions to support the needs of people who are experiencing mental health or other crises.

Resolution authorizing Chair Ron Wesen to electronically sign the submission of Amendment No. 2 with the State of Washington Department of Ecology (Shorelands Northwest Straits Agreement No. SEANWS-2021-SkCoPW-00003) (Skagit County Contract No. C20210470) to support Skagit County Marine Resources Committee (MRC) operations and projects.
- 16. Amendment No. 2 to Skagit County Agreement No. C20210470 with the State of Washington Department of Ecology (Shorelands Northwest Straits Agreement No. SEANWS-2021-SkCoPW-00003) to support Skagit County Marine Resources Committee (MRC) operations and projects. This Amendment revises Task 7: Sharpes Corner stormwater monitoring and its associated deliverables due to staff and volunteer capacity and monitoring requirements, the original proposed work was not able to be completed. The Skagit MRC requested the funds be moved to Task 1. Compensation remains the same and shall not exceed \$196,000. The end of the term remains the same and shall continue until September 30, 2023. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement and prior Amendment shall remain in effect.
- 17. Amendment No. 1 to Local Agency A&E Professional Services Agreement No. C20220365 with Exeltech Engineering, Inc. for the design of eleven (11) Skagit County Fish Passage Improvement Projects. This Amendment adds Phase 2 Scope of Work which includes 100% design development of Stevens Creeks, 60% design development of Butler Creek, 30% design development of Gilligan Creek, and other related work in accordance with the Exhibit A.1. Compensation is increased from \$236,886.80 to an amount not to exceed \$1,173,345.93. The completion date remains the same and shall continue until December 31, 2026. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement shall remain in effect.

Interagency Agreement with Washington State Patrol (WSP) Agreement No. K18484 for the Skagit County Interlocal Drug Enforcement Unit (SCIDEU) to provide office space at the SCIDEU facility for WSP's use. WSP will reimburse SCIDEU \$1,000 per month to assist with the costs of co-housing. The Agreement shall commence on February 1, 2023 and continue until December 31, 2023.
