The purpose of this Amendment is to amend Exhibit "B" Services Provided by WSU – WSU Cooperative Extension shall operate a Shore Stewards program which includes education and outreach to Skagit County residents. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement and subsequent Amendments shall remain effect including the termination date of December 31, 2015, and the compensation amount remains at an amount not to exceed \$596,000.

The purpose of this Amendment is to extend the term of Agreement from March 5, 2015, to March 5, 2016. This Amendment increases compensation by an additional \$8,000 for a new compensation amount not to exceed \$16,000. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement shall remain in effect.
- 12. Amendment #A to Vendor Services Agreement No. C20140086 with United Site Services of Nevada, Inc. to provide delivery, rental, pumping, cleaning and removal of portable chemical toilets, which shall be Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) accessible units, standard units, event units, and deluxe units located in and around County Parks and at the Skagit County Fairgrounds. The purpose of this Amendment is to extend the term of the Agreement from March 5, 2015, to March 5, 2016. This Amendment increases compensation by an additional \$21,920 for a new compensation amount not to exceed \$43,840.
- 13. Resolution calling for bids for the Skagit County Clear Lake Beach Restroom project. The bid opening is scheduled to take place on Monday, March 23, 2015, at 2:30 p.m., or as soon thereafter as possible.
- 14. The purpose of this Amendment is to amend Exhibit "B" Compensation to reflect that compensation shall not exceed \$50,000 for the term of the contract, unless amended. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement and subsequent Amendment shall remain the same including the termination date of December 31, 2018.
- i) <u>PUBLIC HEALTH:</u>

Tim Manns shall be appointed as Kari Odden's alternate; representing the Skagit Land Trust; Nathan (Nate) Biletnikoff of the Shall Puget Sound Refinery shall be appointed to fill the "Local Industry" vacancy; and all other current members shall be reappointed by their current capabilities.

Local Agency A&E Professional Services Consultant Agreement with CivilTech Engineering, Inc. to prepare preliminary design for a new Hansen Creek Bridge to replace an existing two-culvert crossing at Minkler Road Project #WA120328-8. Work includes the collection of survey and geographical data, determination of hydraulic opening and scour depth, and preparation of preliminary design and site layout. The Agreement shall commence on the date of execution and continue until December 31, 2015. Compensation shall not exceed \$96,000.
- 25. Amendment No. 1 to Rural Arterial Program (RAP) Agreement No. C20130206 with the County Road Administration Board (CRAB) to authorize funds for the Bow Hill Road, RAP #2913-01. The purpose of this Amendment is to reduce the scope of the project to allow for a reduced roadway pavement width of 28 feet; due to design issues, soil conditions, and stormwater treatment, the design of the project was altered to meet project requirements. The funding for the project will not change; the County will receive \$1,500,000 as per the original Agreement, with additional funding in the amount of \$806,700 scheduled to be allocated in March of 2015. The estimated project cost is \$2,246,609. There is a 10% match on the Rural Arterial Trust Account (RATA) funds and the County has received \$460,000 in Federal Surface Transportation Project (STP) funds. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement shall remain in effect.
- 26. Local Agency Professional Services Agreement with Osborn Consulting, Inc. to support with the management and administration of flood, stormwater, and drainage projects and coordination of activities necessary for compliance with Skagit County's National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Phase II Municipal Stormwater Permit issued by the Washington State Department of Ecology. The Agreement shall commence on the date of execution and continue until December 31, 2016. Compensation shall not exceed \$200,000.

Several issues delayed finalization of the Agreement including; negotiations between Skagit County, Washington State DOE and the Northwest Straits Commission; technical issues with Washington State DOE's new program for the administration of grants and loans (EAGL).
- 36. Agreement for Grant Sub-Award with Northwest Straits Foundation for services related to Skagit County Marine Resources Committee (MRC) operations and projects including; shoreline landowner workshops, Bowman Bay nearshore restoration, and nearshore restoration monitoring to allow for the Northwest Straits Foundation, on behalf of Skagit MRC, to perform Tasks 4, 5, and 6 as identified in the DOE Grant Agreement No. SEANWS-2014-SkCoPW-00003, Skagit County Contract No. C20140521. The Agreement commenced on October 1, 2014, and continues until September 30, 2015. Compensation shall not exceed \$23,400 and is reimbursable by the DOE Grant Agreement No. SEANWS-2014-SKCoPW-00003, Skagit County Contract No. C20140521.
- 37. Resolution authorizing the ratification of Washington State Recreation and Conservation Office (RCO) Agreement with the Salmon Recovery Funding Board (SRFB), Project No. 14-1263R, to continue the restoration of 26 acres of riparian buffer adjacent to an established Conservation Reserve Enhancement Project (CREP) along the Skagit River and Bow and Martin Sloughs near Rockport, on the left bank of the Skagit River, just upstream of SR530. Skagit County owns the property and will oversee restoration on the site. Finalization of the Agreement was delayed due to the funding reimbursement period to cover any project expenses that incurred as part of project implementation only recently became available.
- 38. Washington State Recreation and Conservation Office (RCO) Agreement with the Salmon Recovery Funding Board (SRFB), Project No. 14-1263R, to continue the restoration of 26 acres of riparian buffer adjacent to an established Conservation Reserve Enhancement Project (CREP) along the Skagit River and Bow and Martin Sloughs near Rockport, on the left bank of the Skagit River, just upstream of SR530. Skagit County owns the property and will oversee restoration on the site. The Agreement commenced on September 18, 2014, and continues until March 15,

2019. The total project cost is \$183,000; RCO will contribute 85% (\$155,550) with Skagit County's Clean Water Fund contributing \$15% (\$27,450).

Resolution authorizing the ratification of a Personal Services Agreement with Skagit Fisheries Enhancement Group (SFEG) to perform work, on a reimbursable basis, to assist Skagit County in completing certain tasks related to the implementation of agricultural and other best management practices consistent with Skagit County's Critical Areas Ordinance and Clean Water Program in 2015. Review of the contract terms delayed finalization of the Agreement.
- 40. Personal Services Agreement with Skagit Fisheries Enhancement Group (SFEG) to perform work, on a reimbursable basis, to assist Skagit County in completing certain tasks related to the implementation of agricultural and other best management practices consistent with Skagit County's Critical Areas Ordinance and Clean Water Program in 2015. The Agreement commenced on January 1, 2015, and continues until December 31, 2015. Compensation shall not exceed \$30,000.
