The Agreement shall commence on the date of execution and continue until June 2015. There is no cost associated with this Agreement.

Vendor Services Agreement with Valley Memorials Inc., dba Hawthorne Funeral Home to have a person available twenty-four (24) hours a day, seven (7) days a week to receive the deceased at the funeral facility or provide the Coroner's office with a key and alarm codes to the funeral facility. The Agreement shall commence on the date of execution and continue until December 31, 2015. Compensation shall not exceed \$5,000.

g) EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES:

11. Amendment No. 1 to Personal Services Agreement No. C20140617 with Aero Skagit for the provision of trauma and verified ambulance services twenty-four (24) hours a day, seven (7) days a week. This Amendment increases compensation by approximately \$20,000 in order to compensate provider for additional items listed in new paragraph 3 of Exhibit "B", compensation associated with the costs of implementing and maintaining of the electronic Patient Care Report (ePCR) data collection system. The term of the Agreement remains the same, ending on December 31, 2018. Compensation shall not exceed \$681,554.96.

h) GEOGRAPHIC INFORMATION SERVICES:

12. Interlocal Cooperative Agreement with the City of Sedro-Woolley to establish a cost sharing partnership for pictometry imagery and software. The Agreement shall commence on the date of execution and continue for two years. Compensation to Skagit County shall not exceed a total of \$8,600.

i) PARKS, RECREATION, AND FAIR:

 Personal Services Agreement with Great American Entertainment Company LLC to provide four (4) daily animal races at the Skagit County Fair taking place August 12, through August 15, 2015. Compensation shall not exceed \$5,000.

The cost of divided maintenance activity shall be relatively equal for both parties. The Agreement shall commence on the date of execution and continue until December 31, 2035.
- 20. Vendor Services Agreement with Industrial Mowing and Spraying to provide mowing services at various roads in Skagit County. The Agreement shall commence on the date of execution and continue for one year. Compensation shall not exceed \$9,950.

The Agreement commenced on January 1, 2015, and continue until December 31, 2015. Compensation shall not exceed \$6,000 plus any applicable sales and use tax.

o) <u>SHERIFF:</u>

- 27. Resolution authorizing acceptance of an award of funds from a Federal Financial Assistance Grant Application between the Washington State Parks and Recreation Commissioners and Skagit County to assist local marine law enforcement recreational boating safety programs.
- 28. Washington State Parks & Recreation Commission 2015 Marine Patrol Federal Financial Assistance Grant Award Letter for Recreational Boating Safety Programs. The grant period commenced on April 1, 2015, and continues until September 30, 2015. Compensation to Skagit County shall not exceed \$25,106.
- 29. Resolution authorizing the ratification of Amendment No. A to Interagency Agreement No. C20140335 with State of Washington Department of Commerce (WSDOC Amendment No. F14-31440-014) through the Community Services and Housing Division, Office of Crime Victims Advocacy, to allow Skagit County to participate in the Multi-Jurisdictional Gang-Drug Task Force Program. The Amendment was delayed because WSDOC only recently received approval to distribute the grant budget line totals.
- 30. Amendment No. A to Interagency Agreement No. C20140335 with State of Washington Department of Commerce (WSDOC Amendment No. F14-31440-014) through the Community Services and Housing Division, Office of Crime Victims Advocacy, to allow Skagit County to participate in the Multi-Jurisdictional Gang-Drug Task Force Program. The purpose of this Amendment is to redistribute the grant budget expenses, the compensation amount to Skagit County remains unchanged at \$149,697. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement remain in effect including the termination date of July 31, 2015.
