- 12. Amendment No. 10 to Interlocal Cooperative Agreement No. C20230495 with Skagit Conservation District to allow the County to work with the District on a reimbursable basis for assistance to be provided by the District to the County in meeting Voluntary Stewardship Program (VSP) enhancement goals through implementation of site-specific projects. This Amendment increases compensation from \$446,112.50 to an amount not to exceed \$489,284.60. The term remains the same and shall continue until June 30, 2025. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement and prior Amendments shall remain in effect.
