6. Amendment No. 1 to Interlocal Cooperative Agreement No. C20240362 with Port of Skagit to award \$500,000 of Economic Development/Public Facilities Projects grant funds to support Watershed Business Park, Project #1. This Amendment extends the term from December 31, 2025 to December 31, 2026 to allow the recipient sufficient time to complete the Project. Compensation remains the same and shall not exceed \$500,000. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement shall remain in effect.

c) FACILITIES MANAGEMENT:

7. Vendor Services Agreement with Dimensional Communications, Inc. to supply all labor, demolition, materials, equipment, and supervision for a prevailing wage project to supply and install new/used AV equipment including the audio video equipment from courtroom #5 and re-install after remodel is complete at the Skagit County Superior Court's 3rd floor hearing room #5, located at 205 West Kincaid Street in Mount Vernon. Compensation is based on a fee schedule and shall not exceed \$13,724.25 including applicable tax. The Agreement shall commence on the date of execution and continue until December 31, 2025.

d) HUMAN RESOURCES:

8. Amendment No. 1 to Vendor Services Agreement No. C20250288 with TransCold Distribution Inc. to deliver food to the Skagit Playfields on July 30, 2025 for the Skagit County All-Staff Summer Event. This Amendment increases compensation from \$1,500 to an amount not to exceed \$1,554.34. The term remains the same and shall continue for one year. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement shall remain in effect.

e) INFORMATION SERVICES:

9. Resolution awarding the Request for Proposal for Website Design, Development and Hosting Services to GHD Digital.

f) PUBLIC HEALTH:

- 10. Amendment No. 3 to Professional Services Contract No. K7237, Skagit County Contract No. C20230533 with Washington State Health Care Authority to provide Substance Use Disorder short-term housing subsidies for Recovery Support Services using opioid abatement funds, for people with substance use disorders who are homeless or at risk of being homeless. This Amendment increases compensation from \$336,433 to an amount not to exceed \$409,766.33 and extends the term of the Agreement to June 30, 2026. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement and prior Amendments shall remain in effect.
- 11. Vendor Services Agreement with Rick's Refrigeration to repair and replace defective parts of the Senior Nutrition Program equipment. Compensation is based on an hourly rate schedule and shall not exceed \$14,000. The Agreement shall commence on September 10, 2025 and continue for one year.
- 12. Personal Services Agreement with Dreamcatcher Facilitation Services to provide Person-Centered-Planning (PCP) services to youth, families, and school district staff throughout Skagit County for the purpose of helping families and school staff partner around the special planning needs of transition-age youth and their Individualized Education Programs (IEPs). Compensation is based on a rate schedule and shall not exceed \$18,000. The Agreement is ratified to commence on July 1, 2025 and continue until June 30, 2026.
- 13. Personal Services Agreement with Wandke Consulting to increase accessibility and inclusion for individuals with developmental disabilities through education and consultation services. Compensation is based on a rate schedule and shall not exceed \$5,000. The Agreement is ratified to commence on July 1, 2025 and continue until June 30, 2026.

- 14. Personal Services Agreement with Skagit Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault Services to staff an emergency shelter that operates 7 days a week and provides 21 shelters beds for women and children fleeing domestic violence. Compensation is based on reimbursement for services schedule and shall not exceed \$53,469. The Agreement is ratified to commence on July 1, 2025 and continue until June 30, 2026.
- 15. Amendment No. 1 to Interagency Agreement No. C20250027 for Reentry Demonstration Initiative Project with Washington State Health Care Authority (HCA) Contract Number K8163 to provide pre-release services for individuals while in or preparing for release from a carceral facility (i.e., state prison, county/city jail, or correction facility). This Amendment updates Statement of Work, Section 4: Milestones to move to Cohort 3 of the Reentry Demonstration Medicaid Waiver Program. Compensation remains the same and shall not exceed \$2,250,000. The term remains the same and shall continue until July 31, 2028. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement shall remain in effect.
- 16. Resolution authorizing Chair Lisa Janicki as the authorized representative to sign the Allocation Agreement(s) and other necessary documents related the Purdue Pharma / Sackler Direct Opioid Settlement.

On or about May 23, 2025, SCSO was reviewing the terms of HIDTA Notice of Award and in the process of the review, electronically completed the acceptance of the award.
- 18. Grant Agreement No. HID1925G0602-00 with the Office of National Drug Control Policy to allow Skagit County Interlocal Drug Enforcement Unit (SCIDEU) to participate in the National High Intensity Drug Trafficking Areas (HIDTA) Program. Compensation to Skagit County Shall not exceed \$131,934. The Agreement is ratified to commence on January 1, 2025 and continue until December 31, 2026.

h) TREASURER:

19. Vendor Services Agreement with J.P. Morgan Chase Bank, N.A. to provide banking services and products. The pricing schedule for fees, fines, and service charges are outlined in Exhibit A. The Agreement is ratified to commence on July 25, 2025 and shall continue for an initial five-year term with the option to renew for an additional three-year term.
