b) BUDGET AND FINANCE:

- 3. Interlocal Cooperative Agreement with Washington State University Northwestern Washington Research and Extension Center to award \$350,000 of Economic Development/Public Facilities Project grant funds to support the Plant Growth Facility Expansion project. This Agreement shall be effective on July 1, 2019, pursuant to Resolution No. R20190120 and continue until June 30, 2020.
- 4. Interlocal Cooperative Agreement with Port of Anacortes to award \$300,000 of Economic Development/Public Facilities Project grant funds to support development of the South Basin Parking Lot project. c) EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES:

5. Interlocal Cooperative Agreement with Fire District 5 (District) to allow the District and the County to work in cooperation on the delivery of emergency medical services (EMS) within the District's boundaries, as well as outside its boundaries as allowed by mutual aid requests. Skagit County shall reimburse the District for actual expenses incurred in an amount not to exceed \$95,000 for the entire term of the Agreement. This Agreement replaces and supersedes Skagit County Contract No. C20190069, is ratified to commence on May 14, 2019, and shall continue until December 31, 2024.

d) FACILITIES MANAGEMENT:

6. Vendor Services Agreement with Lyndale Glass, Inc., to replace a broken window glass pane at the Skagit County Public Defenders Building located at 121 Broadway in Mount Vernon. Compensation shall not exceed \$440.24. The Agreement is ratified to commence on August 1, 2019, and continue for three months from the date of execution.

e) GEOGRAPHIC INFORMATION SERVICES:

7. Amendment No. 3 to General Services Administration Federal Supply Schedule Contract No. GS-35F-0801N Agreement, Skagit County Contract No. C20160494, with Pictometry International Corp. for the purchase and licensing of Pictometry aerial imagery products. This Amendment provides Skagit County with a photogrammetric digital surface model (DSM) of the aerial photography that was taken in 2019. No additional compensation is associated with this Amendment. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement and prior Amendments shall remain in effect.

f) OFFICE OF JUVENILE COURT:

- 8. Interlocal Cooperative Agreement with Burlington-Edison School District to jointly fund the BECCA Case Manager position to serve the School District and the Skagit County Office of Juvenile Court in implementing the truancy portion of the BECCA Bill as outlined by RCW and WAC. Compensation to Skagit County shall not exceed \$216,011. The Agreement is ratified to commence on July 1, 2019, and continue until June 30, 2020.

g) PROSECUTING ATTORNEY:

10. Quit Claim Deed and Real Estate Excise Tax Affidavit for Parcel Numbers P74581, P74582, P74584, P74585, P74586, P74595, P74599, P74600, P74601, 74603, P74605, and P74606 granted by Skagit County to James A. Cook and Terri E. Cook, Elk Properties, LLC, and Leader Lake, LLC for the sole purpose of correcting an inaccuracy in the records of title. No monetary consideration is being paid.

h) PUBLIC HEALTH:

11. WorkFirst Worksite Agreement with Community Action of Skagit County which specifies the functions and responsibilities of the "Worksite" (Burlington, Mount Vernon, and Sedro-Woolley Senior Centers), "Contractor", and "Participant" so that an employee from Community Action of Skagit County can oversee the work component of the Department of Commerce WorkFirst Program. The Agreement is ratified to commence on July 1, 2019, and continue through June 30, 2020.
