b) FACILITIES MANAGEMENT:

5. Vendor Services Agreement with Precision Door Service to install a security storefront and door at the entrance of a County-owned building located 1700 Continental Place in Mount Vernon (aka Sagers Building). Compensation shall not exceed \$8,077 plus any applicable taxes. The Agreement is ratified to commence on August 4, 2017, and shall continue for four (4) months from the date of execution.
6. Personal Services Agreement with Surety Pest Control to provide pest control services to the Concrete Community Center located at 45821 Railroad Street in Concrete and the Ted W. Anderson East County Resource Center located at 45770 Main Street in Concrete. Compensation shall not exceed \$2,000 which is based on an initial service charge of \$355 plus applicable taxes for 90 days of service. Fees for additional services will be mutually agreed upon by Skagit County Facilities Management prior to initiating those services. The Agreement is ratified to commence on August 11, 2017, and shall continue until August 10, 2019.

c) INFORMATION SERVICES:

7. Amendment No. 4 to Vendor Services Agreement No. C20100068 with Technology Unlimited, Inc. to provide image payment processing equipment, software and training. This Amendment upgrades the Aquirt check scanning software to version 7 on a new Windows 10 workstation, which is located in the Treasurer's office. Compensation is increased by an additional \$5,000 for a new compensation amount not to exceed \$80,000. The term of the Agreement remains in effect until terminated. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement shall remain in effect.

d) PUBLIC HEALTH:

8. Community Substance Abuse Block Grant (SABG) Contract with North Sound Behavioral Health Organization, LLC, Contract #NORTH SOUND BHO-SKAGIT CO-SABG-17-19, for one full-time Chemical Dependency Professional to provide opiate outreach services in Skagit County to individuals who use opioid drugs intravenously. Compensation to Skagit County shall not exceed \$100,000 which is based on a fee schedule. The Agreement is ratified to commence on July 1, 2017, and shall continue until June 30, 2019.
9. Personal Services Agreement with Washington Vocational Services to provide services related to the "Parent Coalition" to enable persons with developmental disabilities and their parents/guardians to become effective and involved in accessing community services in Skagit County and to help them attain a stronger voice for meaningful community living. Skagit County shall reimburse Washington Vocational Services an amount not to exceed \$15,000, which is funded by the Washington State Department of Social and Health Services, Division of Developmental Disabilities (DSHS-DDD) millage funds. The Agreement is ratified to commence on August 1, 2017, and shall continue until July 31, 2018.
10. Interagency Agreement (IAA) with the State of Washington Department of Ecology, IAA No. C1800032, to provide Pollution Prevention Assistance Specialists who will provide technical assistance and education outreach to small businesses in an effort to prevent pollution of waters in the State as part of the Local Source Control Partnership program which is overseen by the Washington State Department of Ecology Hazardous Waste and Toxics Reduction Program. Compensation to Skagit County shall not exceed \$207,363 and is based on a fee schedule. The Agreement is ratified to commence on July 1, 2017, and shall continue until June 30, 2019.
11. Amendment No. 1 to Funding Agreement No. C20170356, with Community Action of Skagit County to provide distribution services of low-income housing funds pursuant to Substitute House Bill 2163 and the Emergency Solutions Grant for family shelter operations and staffing.

This Amendment revises page 1, item #1 “Purpose” to delete the phrase “Emergency Solutions Grant” and replace it with “Consolidated Homeless Grant”; replaces Page 6, Exhibit “A”; and increases the amount of compensation by \$38,249.70 for a new compensation amount not to exceed \$171,656. The term remains the same and shall continue until June 30, 2018. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement shall remain in effect.

12. Amendment No. 1 to Funding Agreement No. C20170357 with Community Action of Skagit County to provide distribution services of low-income housing funds pursuant to Substitute House Bill 2163, the Emergency Solutions Grant, and the Consolidated Homeless Grant for rental assistance and case management. This Amendment revises page 1, item #1 “Purpose” to delete the phrase “Emergency Solutions Grant” and replaces it with “Consolidated Homeless Grant”; revises item #3, “Payment” to increase compensation by \$488,649.50 for a new compensation amount not to exceed \$703,689.50. The term remains the same and shall continue until June 30, 2018. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement shall remain in effect.
13. Personal Services Agreement with Paul Schissler Associates, Inc. to provide technical assistance, research, and planning services related to affordable housing within Skagit County. Compensation shall not exceed \$12,000 and is based on a rate schedule. The Agreement is ratified to commence on August 1, 2017, and shall continue until August 1, 2018.
14. Personal Services Agreement with Washington Vocational Services to provide services related to the “Dream Builder” program to contribute to the Skagit County Developmental Disabilities Advisory Board’s goal to provide students and parents with tools for family-centered goal-setting, career exploration and self-advocacy skills. Skagit County shall reimburse Washington Vocational Services an amount not to exceed \$24,000, which is funded by the Washington State Department of Social and Health Services, Division of Developmental Disabilities (DSHS-DDD) millage funds. The Agreement is ratified to commence on August 1, 2017, and shall continue until July 31, 2018.
15. Amendment No. 1 to Personal Services Agreement No. C20170052 with Phoenix Recovery Services to provide services to individuals enrolled in the substance use disorder programs. This Amendment adds Recovery Support Services to the scope of work and increases compensation by \$80,000. The new compensation amount shall not exceed \$170,000. The term of the Agreement remains the same and shall continue until December 31, 2017. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement shall remain in effect.
16. Amendment No. 2 to County Program Agreement No. C20150343 with the Washington State Department of Social & Health Services, Contract No. 1563-43216, to provide services for individuals with developmental disabilities. This Amendment increases compensation to Skagit County by \$5,327 due to serving more clients than initially anticipated. The new compensation amount shall not exceed \$3,302,453. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement shall remain in effect.

e) PUBLIC WORKS:

17. Construction Contract Agreement with Pilchuck Excavating, LLC for the construction of the Trumpeter Creek Restoration Project #WA120327. The work includes, but is not limited to: excavation and grading of a new creek alignment; filling and grading the existing creek alignment; construction of a temporary access; temporary creek diversion; temporary and permanent erosion control measures; placement of habitat structures; salvage and storage of an existing railcar bridge; placement of small mounds; coordinated fish salvage operation; and daylighting a tight-lined swale. The time limit for the completion of the work is a total of thirty (30) working days. Compensation shall not exceed \$210,738.88. The Agreement shall commence on the date of execution and shall continue for one year.
18. Vendor Services Agreement with Whirlwind Services, Inc. to provide maintenance of riparian restoration sites in Skagit County. Work will consist of, but may not be limited to mowing and treatment of all non-native vegetation, which may include weed-eating, spraying, or mowing project sites as outlined in the maintenance timeline. Compensation is based on a maintenance schedule and shall not exceed \$94,559.77 for the term of the Agreement. The Agreement shall commence on the date of execution and shall continue until December 31, 2019.
19. Amendment No. 1 to Vendor Services Agreement No. C20160369 with Pacific Star Marine USA, Inc. for the Outdrive and Maintenance for the M/V Guemes in accordance with the bid

documents outlined in Resolution No. R20160163. This Amendment extends the term of the Agreement from August 22, 2017, to August 21, 2018. The compensation amount remains the same at an amount not to exceed \$173,300. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement shall remain in effect.

20. Amendment No. 2 to Personal Services Agreement No. C20170134 with Aspect Consulting, LLC to provide geotechnical engineering support related to the shoulder slide repair along Samish Island Road #30910, specifically with respect to design of the new storm drain catch basin, outfall, and diffuser section on the steep slope below the wall. This Amendment incorporates Exhibit "B-2" 2017 Aspect Consulting Job Classifications and Rate of Billing. Compensation remains at an amount not to exceed \$26,637. The term of the Agreement remains the same and shall continue until December 31, 2017. All other terms and conditions shall remain in effect.
21. Interlocal Cooperative Agreement with Public Utility District No. 1 of Skagit County to authorize the Equipment Division of Skagit County Public Works to perform specified maintenance on and provide supplies for vehicles owned by the District. The District shall reimburse the County for the actual costs incurred. In addition, the District shall also pay an additional administrative fee of 9% of the County's total actual costs and expenses for the County's services. The Agreement shall commence on the date of execution and continue until December 31, 2021.

f) SHERIFF:

22. Amendment No. 1 to Master Services Agreement No. C20170196 with Securus Technologies, Inc. to install and provide telecommunications and maintenance services for an inmate phone and visitation system. This Amendment is needed due to a change of service provider for the inmate telephone and trust account services for the Skagit County Community Justice Center located at 201 Suzanne Lane in Mount Vernon. Compensation to Skagit County will be based on inmate use and according to a rate schedule. The term of the Agreement remains in effect until July 31, 2024. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement shall remain in effect.
