This Amendment is ratified to commence on July 1, 2021, increases compensation by \$546,816 for a new total not to exceed \$2,027,912, and extends the term to June 30, 2023. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement shall remain in effect.

#### d) FACILITIES MANAGEMENT:

- 11. Amendment No. 1 to Personal Services Agreement No. C20220094 with BCRA, Inc. to provide design and engineering services for the Skagit County Stabilization Campus located at 1420 State Route 20 in Sedro-Woolley. This Amendment increases compensation by \$8,500 to provide future development planning services and meet grant application requirements for the Stabilization Campus. Total compensation shall not exceed \$33,283.49. The term remains the same and shall continue until December 31, 2022. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement shall remain in effect.
- 12. Vendor Services Agreement with Cascade Roofing Company to complete roof repairs at the Public Safety Building located at 600 3<sup>rd</sup> Street in Mount Vernon. Compensation shall not exceed \$38,515.20. The Agreement shall commence on the date of execution and continue until December 31, 2022.
- 13. Vendor Services Agreement with Amigo Tree Service for tree trimming, brush, and tree removal away from overhead power/data lines at the Skagit County Commissioners Building located at 1800 Continental Place, Mount Vernon and the adjacent parking lot located at 1515 East College Way in Mount Vernon. Compensation shall not exceed \$3,481.60. The Agreement shall commence on the date of execution and continue until December 31, 2022.
- 14. Personal Services Agreement with Coffman Engineers, Inc. to complete HVAC replacement design services for the Parker Building (Tech Center) located at 1700 East College Way in Mount Vernon. Compensation shall not exceed \$16,000. The Agreement shall commence on the date of execution and continue until December 31, 2023.

## e) <u>PUBLIC HEALTH:</u>

15. Personal Services Agreement with United General District 304 for Mental Health First Aid training for staff and leadership of contracted providers. Compensation shall not exceed \$2,000. The Agreement is ratified to commence on September 1, 2022 and continue until October 31, 2022.

- 16. Subrecipient Agreement with Catholic Community Services of Western Washington to provide recovery support services to eligible individuals with substance use disorders through a grant from the Washington State Health Care Authority. Compensation shall not exceed \$216,000. The Agreement is ratified to commence on July 1, 2022 and continue until June 30, 2023.
- 17. Personal Services Agreement with Consejo Counseling and Referral Services to provide mental health recovery services to individuals who meet the eligibility criteria with the primary goals of stabilization of problematic symptoms and/or behaviors, and the promotion of ongoing recovery. Compensation shall not exceed \$15,000 and is based on an hourly rate schedule. The Agreement shall commence on the date of execution and continue until December 31, 2022.
- 18. Amendment No. 2 to Personal Services Agreement No. C20210541 with Community Action of Skagit County to prepare and review applications for the Eviction Rental Assistance Program 2.0 (ERAP 2.0) Grant for households who are at or below 80% of Area Median Income and at risk of eviction. This Amendment extends the term of the contract from September 30, 2022 to March 31, 2023. Compensation remains the same and shall not exceed \$500,238. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement and prior Amendment shall remain in effect.
- 19. Amendment No. 1 to Senior Nutrition Services contract No. C20220341 with Northwest Regional Council, Contract No. 241018-NUTR, for the provision of funding for the senior services nutrition program including congregate and home-delivered meals for seniors in Skagit County. This Amendment increases compensation by \$16,069 to provide additional vouchers and produce to low-income seniors through the Senior Farmers' Market Nutrition Program. Total compensation shall not exceed \$377,149. The term remains the same and shall continue until December 31, 2022. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement shall remain in effect.

## f) <u>PUBLIC WORKS:</u>

20. Local Agency A&E Professional Services Agreement with Exeltech Engineering, Inc. for the design of eleven Skagit County Fish Passage Improvement Projects. Compensation shall not exceed \$236,886.80. The Agreement shall commence on September 12, 2022 and continue until December 31, 2026.

### g) SHERIFF:

- 21. Interagency Agreement with the State of Washington Department of Commerce (DOC) through the Community Services Division, Community Safety Unit, Justice Assistance Grant/Byrne Formula Grant to allow Skagit County to participate in the multi-jurisdictional drug, gang and violent crime enforcement unit, DOC Contract No. F20-31440-209. Compensation to Skagit County shall not exceed \$226,563. The Agreement is ratified to commence on July 1, 2022 and continue until September 30, 2023.
- 22. Amendment No. 1 to Memorandum of Understanding, Agreement No. C20220345, with the Federal Bureau of Investigation to participate in the Northwest Border Transnational Organized Crime Western Hemisphere Task Force for the purpose of setting operational standards. This Amendment adds a Cost Reimbursement Agreement for overtime payments made to officers assigned to and working full-time on task force related matters. The term remains the same and shall continue until terminated. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement shall remain in effect.
