Amendment No. 1 to Personal Services Agreement No. C20250013 with Sunrise Services to provide mental health services with primary goals of stabilization of problematic symptoms and/or behaviors, and the promotion of ongoing recovery to individuals who meet eligibility criteria. Compensation is increased from \$20,000 to an amount not to exceed \$33,000 for additional services. The term remains the same and shall continue until December 31, 2025.
- 9.
