- 24. Personal Services Agreement with Phoenix Recovery to provide urinalysis testing and case management to Mental Health Court participants. The Agreement shall commence on January 1, 2016, and continue until December 31, 2016. Compensation shall not exceed \$48,000, is based on a fee schedule and is funded by the 1/10th of 1% chemical dependency or mental health treatment sales tax.

 - 58. Personal Services Agreement with Northup Group to provide psychological examinations for potential and existing employees of the Skagit County Sheriff's Office. The Agreement commenced on November 1, 2015, and continues until December 31, 2020. Year 2015 compensation rates for each psychological exam plus fees incurred in mailing or delivery shall not exceed \$340. Session rates will be determined according to established rates thereafter.

b) EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES:

3. Amendment No. 3 to Personal Services Agreement No. C20140616 with Central Valley Ambulance Authority for the provision of trauma and verified ambulance services 24 hours per day/7 days per week. The purpose of this Amendment is to reimburse Central Valley Ambulance Authority for six (6) video laryngoscopes in an amount not to exceed \$48,000 and six (6) ventilator devices in an amount not to exceed \$84,000 for a new compensation amount not to exceed \$2,100,180. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement and subsequent Amendments shall remain in effect including the termination date of December 31, 2018.
