COMMISSIONERS' OFFICE:

1. Record of the Proceedings for Monday, December 5, 2005.

FACILITY MANAGEMENT:

- 2. Amendment No. 1 to Lease Agreement No. <u>C20020308</u> between Skagit County and the Humane Society of Skagit Valley, which maps out the term (35 years) and lessee obligation for the lease of property commonly known as 18911 Kelleher Road, Burlington. All other terms and conditions of the original contract shall remain in effect.
- 3. Resolution awarding the bid for the partial remodel of the first floor of the Skagit County Larry E. Moller Public Safety Building to Roosendaal-Honcoop Construction, Inc. in the amount of \$157,000.

FAIRGROUNDS:

4. Resolution authorizing payment to Southern Bleacher Company, Inc., for work performed at the Skagit County Fairgrounds in early 2005 in the amount of \$31,490.62.

HUMAN RESOURCES:

5. Resolution approving the transfer of sick leave for an employee in the Skagit County Public Works Department.

HUMAN SERVICES:

- 6. Personal Services Agreement with NAMI (National Alliance for the Mentally Ill) to provide education and outreach programs to mental health professionals, consumers, family members and high school students. The agreement shall commence on January 1, 2006, and continue through December 31, 2006. Compensation shall not exceed \$10,000.
- 7. Personal Services Agreement with Skagit Preschool and Resource Center (SPARC), which will provide, through its Skagit County Parent to Parent Program, various services to parents of children with special needs. The agreement shall commence on November 1, 2005, and continue through June 30, 2007. Compensation is not to exceed \$28,000.

GEOGRAPHICAL INFORMATION SERVICES:

8. Interlocal Cooperative Agreement, per Resolution No. R20050377, between Skagit County and Island County to provide geographic information services, including administration; consulting; data acquisition; data creation; data formatting; data analysis; data maintenance; writing specifications; writing legal descriptions; creating statistical reports; research and error investigation; record keeping; software development; database development; training; custom graphics and map creation. The agreement shall commence upon the date of signature and continue through January 1, 2008.

PLANNING & DEVELOPMENT SERVICES:

9. Amendment No. 3 to Personal Services Agreement <u>No. C20040062</u> between Skagit County and Kelly Services, Inc., to provide front counter receptionist coverage and other temporary office assistance as needed. The amendment increases the hourly rate to \$14.54, increasing total

compensation by \$10,000, and extends the contract termination date to December 31, 2006. All other terms and conditions of the original contract shall remain in effect.

PROSECUTING ATTORNEY:

10. Personal Services Agreement between Skagit County and Clothier & Head, P.S., which will provide investigative services for the Prosecuting Attorney in a criminal investigation including, but not limited to accounting practices of the parties and testimony for court hearings as required. The agreement shall commence on January 1, 2005, and continue through December 31, 2006. Total compensation is not to exceed \$30,000.

SENIOR SERVICES:

11. Resolution AND Interlocal Cooperative Agreement between Skagit County and the City of Anacortes to allow Skagit County Senior Services to provide staff, equipment and materials for the delivery of community based services to the senior citizens of Anacortes. The agreement shall commence on January 1, 2006, and continue through December 31, 2006. Total compensation is not to exceed \$26,867.

SHERIFF'S OFFICE:

- 12. Amendment No. A to Vendor Services Agreement <u>No.C20040127</u> with Glow Cleaners, which provides laundering and dry cleaning of employee uniforms. The amendment extends the expiration date from December 31, 2005, to December 31, 2006. All other terms and conditions of the original contract shall remain in effect.
- 13. Federal Indirect Homeland Security Grant through the Washington State Patrol, which provides equipment to local law enforcement solely for the purpose of enhancing capabilities for detecting, deterring, disrupting and preventing acts of terrorism in accordance with the Law Enforcement Terrorism Prevention Program (LETPP) guidelines for Federal fiscal year 2004. This agreement shall commence on December 1, 2003, and continue through October 31, 2005. Total compensation is not to exceed \$98,933.81.

TREASURER:

14. Resolution approving the revised Skagit County Investment Policy as recommended by the Skagit County Finance Committee.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:

- 15. Resolution calling for bids for the overhaul of the MV Guemes Island Ferry spare outdrive. The bid opening will be held on Tuesday, January 3, 2006, at 10:30 a.m.
- 16. Personal Services Agreement between Skagit County and H.R. 18. Amendment No. 2 to Local Agency Standard Consultant Agreement <u>No. C20040293</u> with Nicholls Engineering for work on the Helmick Road Improvement Project. The amendment extends the expiration date to December 31, 2007, and the scope of work is supplemented to add Phase III. The compensation is also increased by \$10,950 to accommodate the additional Phase III work, for a new maximum amount payable of \$78,610. All other terms and conditions of the original agreement shall remain in effect.
