The amendment will extend the agreement to March 31, 2004 and amend the rate of compensation for Bart Freedman and Theodore Angelis.
- 17. Partial Satisfaction and Release of Judgment in the Halverson, et. al v. Skagit County as it relates to Sam (Charles) and Mary Dodge, which will pay \$1,409.32 for said release.
- 18. Personal Services Agreement with Buck and Gordon, LLP to provide consultation, legal services and litigation support on selected legal issues relating to the Growth Management Act and other land use and environmental issues. The agreement shall begin on January 1, 2004, and continue through December 31, 2004. Compensation shall not exceed \$180,000.

SENIOR SERVICES:

19. Amendment No. 3 to <u>Contract No. C2003001</u> with Northwest Regional Council to provide congregate/home delivered meals and Title V senior employment services. The amendment reflects various changes in costs and budget for the project.

SUPERIOR COURT:

20. Personal Services Agreement with Northwest Family & Children's Services for Guardian ad Litem services required for dependency cases filed and heard in Skagit County Superior Court. The agreement shall begin on January 1, 2004, and continue through December 31, 2004. Compensation shall not exceed \$90,000.

YOUTH & FAMILY SERVICES:

21. Personal Services Agreement with The Center, Inc. to provide specialized child, adolescent, adult and family assessment, evaluation and treatment (group and/or individual and/or families) consultation, education classes, monitoring with written reports as required, and training as referred by the County. The agreement shall begin on January 1, 2004, and continue through December 31, 2005. Compensation will vary depending on the service provided and will not exceed \$10,000.

PUBLIC WORKS:

- 22. Amendment No. 1 to <u>Contract No. C20030424</u> with Leonard, Boudinot & Skodje, Inc. to provide engineering, permitting, and construction services related to the Britt Slough Trunk Storm Sewer Project. The amendment will begin on October 30, 2003 and will extend the terms of the agreement to December 31, 2004. Compensation will increase by \$10,000 for a new total of \$20,000.
- 23. Amendment No. 2 to Task Assignment #2 of <u>Contract No. C20030036</u> Personal Services Agreement with Pacific International, PLLC. The amendment will allow the contractor to perform additional work on the Burlington Northern Santa Fe Project as part of the Skagit River Flood Protection/Salmon Restoration Project. The amendment is effective November 1, 2003 and will increase compensation by \$26,000 for a new total of \$159,000.
- 24. Amendment No.2 to Task Assignment #3 of <u>Contract No. C20030036</u> Personal Services Agreement with Pacific International, PLLC. The amendment will allow the contractor to provide hydraulic engineering expertise for an evaluation of flood storage for Lower and Upper Baker Dams as park of the Skagit River Flood Protection/Salmon Restoration Project. The effective date of the amendment is November 1, 2003. Compensation will be increased by \$95,000 for a new total of \$384,220.
- 25. Amendment No. 2 to Task Assignment #4 of <u>Contract No. C20030036</u> Personal Services Agreement with Pacific International, PLLC. The amendment will allow the contractor to provide additional hydraulic modeling of the Skagit maintem and overbank areas calibrated to the October 2003 high water marks as part of the Skagit River Flood Protection/Salmon Restoration Project. The effective date of the amendment is November 1, 2003. Compensation will be increased by \$34,100 for a new total of \$145,100.
- 26. Amendment No. 4 to <u>Contract No. C20030036</u> Personal Services Agreement with Pacific International, PLLC. The amendment will allow the contractor to perform additional work on the Burlington Northern Santa Fe Project, hydraulic engineering and modeling of the Skagit maintem and overbank areas as part of the River Flood Protection/Salmon Restoration Project. The amendment is effective November 1, 2003 and will increase compensation by \$155,100 for a new total of \$777,320.
