f) PUBLIC HEALTH:

- 10. Amendment No. 1 to Personal Services Agreement No. C20240684 with Community Action of Skagit County to process mileage reimbursement requests for Skagit Meals on Wheels volunteers. This Amendment increases compensation for reimbursement for mileage for volunteer drivers from \$15,000 to \$19,500. The term remains the same and shall continue until December 31, 2025. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement shall remain in effect.
- 11. Interlocal Agreement with Skagit Transit to allow Skagit Transit the ability to donate a surplus Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) vehicle to Skagit County for use by a non-profit homeless service provider. There is no compensation associated with this Agreement. The Agreement is ratified to commence on November 19, 2025 and continue until terminated.

g) PUBLIC WORKS:

12. Resolution calling for bids for the procurement of maintenance materials (liquid asphalt, mixed asphalt, gravel, and rock products) with annual purchases expected to exceed \$25,000. - 13. Personal Services Agreement with Kai Ottesen and Jules Riske, dba Belle Bean Services, LLC to provide annual monitoring services to Skagit County's Farmland Legacy Program conservation easements. Compensation shall not exceed \$80,000 and is based on an hourly fee. The Agreement shall commence on January 1, 2026 and continue until December 31, 2027.
- 14. Interlocal Cooperative Agreement with Skagit County Drainage and Irrigation District Consortium, LLC to allow the County to work with the Consortium on a reimbursable basis for assistance to be provided by the Consortium to the County related to coordinating Drainage and Irrigation District issues and matters. Compensation is based on reimbursement for the work and services performed and shall not exceed \$100,000. The Agreement shall commence on January 1, 2026 and continue until December 31, 2027.
- 15. Interlocal Cooperative Agreement with Skagit Conservation District to coordinate the development and implementation of a stormwater education and outreach program in Skagit County to continue to meet requirements of the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Western Washington Phase II Municipal Stormwater Permit. Compensation is based on a fee schedule and shall not exceed \$16,292. The Agreement shall commence on the date of mutual execution and shall continue until December 31, 2026.
- 16. Interlocal Cooperative Agreement with Skagit Conservation District to perform work, on a reimbursable basis, to assist the County with coordination of the development, implementation, and maintenance of water quality programs to meet the goals of the Clean Water Program (Shellfish Protection District). Compensation shall not exceed \$263,000, The Agreement shall commence on January 1, 2026 and shall continue until December 31, 2026.
- 17. Interlocal Cooperative Agreement with City of Sedro-Woolley to allow each party to perform work and provide materials and equipment upon request for roadway maintenance activities on a reimbursable basis. The Agreement shall commence on January 1, 2026 and continue until December 31, 2030.
- 18. Local Agency A&E Professional Services Negotiated Hourly Rate Consultant Agreement with David Evans and Associates, Inc. for the design of the North Osterman Creek Crossing FEMA Project No. 4593DR-WA-188906. Compensation shall not exceed \$824,815. The Agreement shall commence on the date of mutual execution and continue until December 31, 2028.
- 19. Amendment No. 1 to Personal Services Agreement No. C20250240 with Herrera Environmental Consultants to complete an alternatives analysis, preliminary, and final design for the Lorenzan Creek Stormwater Improvement Project to improve water quality, fish passage and habitat, and reduce upstream drainage concerns near the Concrete Public Works Facility located at 44510 Concrete Sauk Valley Road in Concrete. This Amendment extends the term of the Agreement from December 31, 2025 to December 31, 2026 to continue work through final design and permitting and updates the rates of the 2026 classifications in Exhibit "B". Compensation remains the same and shall not exceed \$180,002.25 and is based on a rate schedule. All other terms and conditions of the original Agreement shall remain in effect.

h) SHERIFF:

20. Professional Services Agreement with Gladiator Forensics, LLC to provide managed hosting and operational support for software used by the Skagit County Sheriff's Office. Compensation shall not exceed \$24,000 and Skagit County will be invoiced annually for hosting fees. The Agreement shall commence on the date of execution and continue for one year. At the end of the term, the Agreement will renew automatically for successive one-year terms and the then-applicable fees and terms.
