

Skagit County - Government Relations Report February 1, 2020

Now only a week away from the first cutoff deadline, this week, the Legislature scrambled to fit in as many hearings and executive sessions as possible to ensure their bills pass out of policy committees. Bills must pass out of policy committees by Friday, February 7th, to continue in the legislative process, while bills that have a fiscal impact have been referred to a fiscal committee, where they will need to pass out by Tuesday, February 11th. Bills that passed a policy committee that don't have a fiscal impact are automatically referred to the Rules Committee until they are pulled to the floor.

We look forward to seeing Commissioner Janicki in Olympia next week for Legislative Steering Committee.

Legislative Priorities

Historic Skagit Courthouse Seismic Repairs

Skagit County is requesting \$150,000 in the Capital Budget for design and preconstruction for seismic repairs on the historic County Courthouse. <u>Sen. Liz Lovelett</u> (D- Anacortes) is sponsoring the request in the Senate, while <u>Rep. Alex Ramel</u> (D- Bellingham) is sponsoring the House request. Both request forms have now been submitted to their sponsors who will forward the request to Capital Budget leadership.

House Bill 1590 – Councilmanic Local Option Housing Sales Tax

Skagit County is supporting <u>House Bill 1590</u>, sponsored by <u>Rep. Beth Doglio</u> (D- Olympia), as a potential tool for the County to fund affordable housing and human services programs. Both House Bill 1590 and its Senate companion, <u>Senate Bill 6126</u>, have been referred to their respective Rules Committees and are waiting to be pulled to the floor. Last week, GTHGA and Commissioner Janicki met with Rep. Doglio to discuss the request. Rep. Doglio indicated that she is introducing amendments to the bill resulting from stakeholder work with certain cities within King County; however, both Skagit County and the cities involved in the stakeholder process have yet to receive draft language.

King County has introduced legislation allowing King County to levy a business and occupation tax for affordable housing and human services, <u>House Bill 2709</u>. The bill is scheduled for a hearing next Tuesday, February 4th, in the House Finance Committee. While the bill was not proposed as an alternative to HB 1590 / SB 6126, it is possible this proposal will complete with HB 1590 / SB 6126. This situation is emergent and GTHGA will remain engaged with the prime sponsor and other proponents to determine strategy going forward.

<u>Supporting Other Association Priorities:</u> Separate Funding Stream for Involuntary Treatment Costs Nothing to report this week.

MAT Funding



The Association of Washington Cities is seeking funding to increase the use of medication assisted treatment (MAT). Their current hope is to secure a budget proviso for an assessment of how to replicate the type of services being offered at the South Correctional Entity (SCORE) which is confinement center providing services to seven member cities located in south King County. SCORE provides a relatively high-level of treatment services, including MAT. This approach may prove useful in developing a model that can be replicated statewide. Rep. Erwin and Rep. Stokesbary have agreed to support the proposal in the House while Sen. Cleveland will be supporting in the Senate.

Increased Share of Marijuana Revenue

Snohomish County is leading the effort to increase the amount of revenue shared by the state with local governments. The bill, <u>House Bill 2900</u>, sponsored by <u>Rep. Strom Peterson</u> (D- Edmonds) was dropped on Tuesday and was referred to the Appropriations Committee. A hearing has not been scheduled.
