

# **Skagit County - Government Relations Report February 22, 2020**

Bills that remain under consideration have been referred to committees in the opposite chamber and will need to be heard and voted out of committee by Friday, February 28<sup>th</sup>, which is the opposite chamber policy committee cutoff. In an unusual move, the Senate introduced their Capital Budget proposal on Wednesday, February 19<sup>th</sup>, much earlier than expected; the House is scheduled to release their Capital Budget proposal on Tuesday, February 25<sup>th</sup>. The House and Senate Operating and Transportation budget proposals are also scheduled to be released early next week. This year, the Senate will be releasing their proposal first, followed by the House. The House and the Senate will begin their negotiations on final budgets once each of their proposals are released.

The latest revenue forecast anticipates a significant increase in state revenues next biennium; however, the Supplemental Capital Budget is funded with bond proceeds that were authorized during the 2019 legislative session. Therefore, the higher than anticipated state revenue collections do not impact the funding available in the Supplemental Capital Budget.

We look forward to seeing Deputy County Administrator Kayla Schott-Bresler next Thursday to testify on the County's priority legislation, House Bill 1590.

# **Legislative Priorities**

### Historic Skagit Courthouse Seismic Repairs

Skagit County is requesting \$150,000 in the Capital Budget for design and preconstruction for seismic repairs on the historic County Courthouse. Rep. Debra Lekanoff (D- Bow) is sponsoring the House request and has confirmed submission of the forms. Rep. Dave Paul (D- Oak Harbor) has submitted a letter in support of the request and we have drafted a letter of request for Sen. Liz Lovelett (D- Anacortes) to submit to Senate Capital Budget Lead Sen. David Frockt (D- Seattle) once the House Capital Budget has been released. The House Capital Budget proposal is set to be released on Tuesday, Feb. 25<sup>th</sup>.

#### <u>House Bill 1590 – Councilmanic Local Option Housing Sales Tax</u>

Skagit County is supporting <u>House Bill 1590</u>, sponsored by <u>Rep. Beth Doglio</u> (D- Olympia), as a potential tool for the County to fund affordable housing and human services programs. Both House Bill 1590 and its Senate companion, <u>Senate Bill 6126</u>, were referred to their respective Rules Committees and House Bill 1590 was placed on the floor calendar for a vote. Early last week, we learned that the bill's multiple amendments, including Rep. Doglio's striker set to move forward, were ruled out of the scope of the title of the bill. Stakeholders shifted their efforts to trying to move SB 6126, however, negotiations in the Senate fell apart. The House passed the underlying version of HB 1590 with the agreement that Rep. Doglio's striker, which includes expenditure of at least 30 percent of revenue collected by King County for the Cities of Redmond and Bellevue, will be adopted in committee.

### **Supporting Other Association Priorities:**

Separate Funding Stream for Involuntary Treatment Costs



WSAC has submitted the language for the ITA budget proviso. Once the House budgets are released, we will have more information on whether the funding stream will be separated.

#### MAT Funding

The Association of Washington Cities is seeking funding to increase the use of medication assisted treatment (MAT). They have submitted a budget proviso for an assessment of how to replicate the type of services being offered at the South Correctional Entity (SCORE) which is confinement center providing services to seven member cities located in south King County. SCORE provides a relatively high-level of treatment services, including MAT. This approach may prove useful in developing a model that can be replicated statewide. Rep. Irwin and Rep. Stokesbary have agreed to support the proposal in the House while Sen. Cleveland will be supporting in the Senate.

#### Increased Share of Marijuana Revenue

Snohomish County is leading the effort to increase the amount of revenue shared by the state with local governments. The bill, <u>House Bill 2900</u>, sponsored by <u>Rep. Strom Peterson</u> (D- Edmonds) is in the Appropriations Committee. Rep. Peterson is working to request a hearing for the bill and will be scheduling a work session on the topic in his committee.
