

Skagit County - Government Relations Report March 7, 2020

With less than a week remaining of the 2020 legislative session, the Legislature will focus on reconciling differences between each chamber's budget proposals, and differences between bills that passed each chamber with differing amendments. Bills needed to have passed the opposite chamber by this past Friday, March 6, to remain under consideration. The legislative session is scheduled to conclude (sine die) on March 12.

If both chambers have approved identical versions of a bill, the bill has been delivered to the Governor's Office to be signed into law. Bills received by the Governor's Office on or before March 5 will be signed within 5 days of receipt. All other bills will be signed within 20 days of being delivered to the Governor's Office, making April 4 the final day that bills will be signed into law. Unless indicated otherwise in the bill, bills will be effective law starting June 11.

Legislative Priorities

House Bill 1590 - Councilmanic Local Option Housing Sales Tax

This was an exciting week for us in advocating for HB 1590. The bill has had a series of ups and downs throughout legislative session, and its fate was uncertain through the week. The bill was pulled from the Senate Rules Committee late last week. We spoke with all three of Skagit County's Senate members at least once, including a discussion on Thursday with Commissioner Janicki and Senator Lovelett. The bill was finally passed off the Senate floor on Friday, March 6th, with a narrow 27-21 margin. Member votes were mixed, with Republican support coming from Sen. Maureen Walsh (R-Walla Walla) and opposition to the bill from moderate democrats Sen. Steve Hobbs (D- Lake Stevens) and Sen. Mark Mullet (D- Issaquah). The bill was amended by the Senate to:

- Include 30 percent revenue sharing with eligible King County cities;
- Reinstate the voter-approved tax option; and
- Allow cities within a county that has not taken the full tax by September 30, 2020 to impose the remainder of the tax.

These amendments were agreed to by the House sponsor and other advocates, so we expect that the House will concur on the amendments before sine die on Thursday, March 12.

In addition to our work on HB 1590, this last week we communicated the County's positions on the remaining priority bills and budget items, listed below, that are still in play. We will continue to advocate for these positions as session wraps up later this week.
