The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session on the above noted date with Commissioners Norris and Rohrer present. Commissioner Mansfield was absent.

DISCUSSION - DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL AND HEALTH SERVICES ANNOUNCEMENT OF AVAILABILITY OF SECOND-YEAR FUNDING FOR COUNTY PREVENTION/EARLY INTERVENTION PROGRAMS - JoAnn Angevine, Community Services Coordinator.

JoAnn Angevine explained that the County has been notified of the availability of second-year funding for County Prevention/Early Intervention Programs by the Department of Social and Health Services. These funds, amounting to \$11,644, will be awarded for the state fiscal year beginning July 1, 1984, and ending June 30, 1985. Before a contract will be issued for these funds, the County must submit to the Bureau of Alcohol and Substance Abuse an acceptable Prevention/Early Intervention Plan which is based on certain guidelines.

Ms. Angevine explained that she sent out requests for proposals to four different agencies. The Skagit County Alcohol Administrative Board and the Skagit County Mental Health/Drug Abuse Administrative Board will review the proposals and make a recommendation to the Board of Commissioners. The Board of Commissioners will have final selection approval authority and will be the official contracting body for the project.

Chairman Norris asked if this year the project might be in the Sedro Woolley, Burlington or Concrete school districts. Ms. Angevine stated that these areas might be targeted for the funds.

The Board thanked Ms. Angevine for being present for the discussion.

MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS

Robert Taylor, Commissioners' Assistant, presented the following items:

1. The Board approved the request of Tom Moser, Prosecuting Attorney, to allow Janice Ellington to attend a Career Prosecutor Course in Houston, Texas, July 5 through 20, 1984. Mr. Moser was present to explain that the money for this seminar was in their budget, and they were simply requesting the Board's permission for Ms. Ellington to attend.
2. The Board approved the request of Bob Schofield to send one staff member to a Planning Conference in Steamboat Springs, Colorado, June 11 through 13, 1984.
3. The Board reviewed the following Petitions for Property Tax Refund:
 - a. Ray E. Galbreath, 1524 12th Street, Mount Vernon, Washington 98273, in the amount of \$56.64 for tax year 1984, for senior citizen exemption. (#844587)
 - b. Veneta M. Erickson, 2725 E. Fir, Sp. 27, Mount Vernon, Washington 98273, in the amount of \$137.86 for tax years 1982 and 1983, for senior citizen exemption. (#844689)

Commissioner Rohrer motioned to approve the above listed Petitions for Property Tax Refunds, as recommended by the Assessor and Treasurer. Chairman Norris seconded the motion. The motion was carried and so ordered.

4. Commissioner Rohrer motioned to approve the Record of the Proceedings for Monday, April 23, 1984, and Tuesday, April 24, 1984. Chairman Norris seconded the motion. The motion was carried and so ordered.
5. Commissioner Rohrer motioned to adopt the resolution awarding the bid for the chain link fencing material for the Skagit Playfield Parks' outfield fencing to Northwest Fence Co., 8022 15th N.W., Seattle, Washington 98117, for the total amount of \$3,594.90. Chairman Norris seconded the motion. The motion was carried and so ordered.

DISCUSSION - CONSOLIDATED JUVENILE SERVICES - Terry Rousseau, Administrator, Juvenile Court Probation.

Terry Rousseau introduced June Rauschmier, Regional Administrator for Division of Juvenile Rehabilitation (Everett office), and Brad Garner, Juvenile Parole Counselor. Mr. Rousseau explained that both of these people would be active in the Consolidated Juvenile Services Program.

Mr. Rousseau reviewed a previous discussion he had with the Board in which concerns were raised with regard to the possibility of the State funding this project only for a period of time. He explained that since

that discussion, the State has agreed to handle all administration of the program through their Everett office. Services would be available to Skagit County juveniles through County referrals.

Chairman Norris stated that he had earlier had concerns that the program would be funded by the State in the initial stages, but eventually be left to the County to carry on. Having the State administrate the program resolved that concern.


The Board thanked Mr. Rousseau, Ms. Rauschmier, and Mr. Garner for being present for the discussion.

ADJOURNMENT


Commissioner Rohrer motioned to adjourn the proceedings. Chairman Norris seconded the motion. The motion was carried and so ordered.


