1. Proclamation - Skagit County Drunk Driving Awareness Week, December 15-21, 1985, and Designating the Month of December, 1985, as "AWARE Designated Driver Month" in Skagit County.
  2. Discussion - Exchange of County Owned Property.

MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS

The Skagit County Board of Commissioners met in regular session on Tuesday, December 10, 1985, with Commissioners Vaux, Walberg and Rohrer present.

1. Proclamation - Skagit County Drunk Driving Awareness Week, December 15-21, 1985, and Designating the Month of December, 1985, as "AWARE Designated Driver Month" in Skagit County.

Amy Hughes, DWI Task Force Coordinator, introduced Joe Krause, who is an active member of the DWI Task Force. Mr. Krause is also owner of Skagit-Northwest Distributing Company.

Mr. Krause informed the Board of several designated driver programs which are used, especially during this holiday season, to make people aware of problems and solutions with regard to the combination of alcohol and driving.

Chairman Vaux read aloud the proclamation recognizing drinking and drugged driving as a primary hazard to life and property. The Board joined with the President of the United States in proclaiming the week of December 15 through 21, 1985, as "National Drunk and Drugged Driving Awareness Week" and further designated the month of December as "AWARE Designated Driver Month" in Skagit County. Chairman Vaux, Commissioner Walberg and Commissioner Rohrer signed the proclamation.

2. Discussion - Exchange of County Owned Property.

Jim Parker explained that he owns a parcel of property adjacent to an abandoned County landfill site. Prior to purchasing the property, he was not aware of the landfill so near his property. Since the Board denied his Rezone Request #R-85-006 to develop his property, Mr. Parker was interested in an exchange of property with the County. He stated that his time was limited due to the appeal period, should he need to appeal the Board's decision.

Commissioner Walberg stated that there were two issues to be considered:

- a. The rezone appeal period, and
- b. Any impact on the rezone request from the landfill.

Commissioner Walberg felt that until it was determined that the landfill had impacted Mr. Parker's property, the County was not interested in any exchange of property.

Mr. Parker stated that his rezone request was denied because of his property's location near the landfill.

Commissioner Rohrer stated that he felt the landfill's proximity to Mr. Parker's property was one reason to deny the request.

Mr. Parker stated that his property has been impacted by the landfill.

Chairman Vaux advised Mr. Parker to file an appeal to the Board's decision in order to leave that option open. He suggested that the County might want to dig several test wells around the landfill to determine if there would be any impact on Mr. Parker's property. He informed Mr. Parker that the Board had not ruled out any option.

Mr. Theodoratus stated that the Permit Center had informed him that the appeal period begins with the date the resolution is signed (November 15, 1985) and runs for 30 days thereafter.

#### MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS

Robert Taylor, Administrative Officer, presented the following items:

1. The Board approved for signature a Contract for Professional Services between the Skagit County Parks, Recreation and Senior Services Department and Alan Williams, 307 South 11th, Mount Vernon, Washington 98273, for services as a basketball official. This contract shall be in effect December 15, 1985, through October 1, 1986, and compensation shall be per game as follows: Slowbreak: \$12.50 for Level II, \$11.00 for Level I; Custer League Fastbreak: \$15.50 for Level II, \$14.00 for Level I; Youth: \$10.50 for Level II, \$9.00 for Level I.
2. Commissioner Rohrer motioned to adopt the resolution establishing a Solid Waste Construction Fund to be designated as the Incineration/Resource Recovery Construction Fund. Commissioner Walberg seconded the motion. The motion was carried unanimously. (Resolution #10674)

3. Commissioner Rohrer motioned to approve the following Petitions for Property Tax Refund, as recommended by the Skagit County Assessor and Treasurer:
  - a. James H. Hoque, 17421 S.E. 46th Place, Issaquah, Washington 98027, in the amount of \$118.90, as ordered by the Board of Equalization. (#581170f)
  - b. William A. Olson, 1401 S. 13th, Mount Vernon, Washington 98273, in the amount of \$134.01, as ordered by the State Board of Tax Appeals. (#007485)
  - c. Ridgeview Terrace Association, c/o National Partner Management, 11027 N.E. 4th, Bellevue, Washington 98004, in the amount of \$1,084.38, as ordered by the Board of Equalization. (#581170k)
  - d. John Dower, 202 Swinomish Drive, La Conner, Washington 98257, in the amount of \$162.54, as ordered by the Board of Equalization. (#581170e)
  - e. Karen Halgren et al, 15609 N.E. 160th Street, Woodinville, Washington 98072, in the amount of \$100.09, due to reinstatement into the open space program. (#007985)
  - f. Day Creek Community Club, 1098 Warfield Road, Sedro Woolley, Washington 98284, in the amount of \$65.32, due to exemption. (#850582)

Commissioner Walberg seconded the motion. The motion was carried unanimously.

4. Vouchers audited and certified by the auditing officer as required by R.C.W. 42.24.080, and those expense reimbursement claims certified as required by R.C.W. 42.24.090, have been recorded on a listing which has been made available to the Board.

As of this date, December 10, 1985, the Board, by a unanimous vote, did approve for payment those vouchers included in the above-mentioned list and further described as follows: Voucher #JV1009 (Warrants #59841 through #59882) in the total amount of \$9,345.00. (P/R-23)

5. Commissioner Rohrer motioned to schedule the following Planning Commission referred items for 10:00 a.m., Tuesday, December 17, 1985: Rezone Request #R-85-010 of Robert Ragan and Allan Graham; Rezone Request #R-84-011 of Skagit County Department of Parks and Recreation; and Shoreline Substantial Development/Conditional Use/Variance Request #25-85


of Skagit County Department of Parks and Recreation. Commissioner Walberg seconded the motion. The motion was carried unanimously.



Commissioner Walberg motioned to adjourn the proceedings. Commissioner Rohrer seconded the motion. The motion was carried unanimously.


