The Skagit County Board of Commissioners met in regular session on Tuesday, February 11, 1986, with Commissioners Vaux and Walberg present. Commissioner Rohrer was absent.

DISCUSSION - JERE LaFOLLETTE - REPORT ON CHILD ABUSE PROGRAM.

Jere LaFollette, Director of the Skagit Community Mental Health Center, updated the Board on their child abuse treatment program. He noted that the County's contribution over the past several years has enabled this program to become a part of the Skagit Community Mental Health Center's programs. Mr. LaFollette introduced Nancy Larson and Carl Holzmuller, of the Center; Barbara Thompson and Yvonne Messick, of Child Protective Services, Department of Social and Health Services; Tom Moser, Skagit County Prosecuting Attorney; and Marilyn Lupinacci, President of the Skagit County Council for Child Abuse Prevention.

Tom Moser spoke of the benefits of the child abuse treatment program.

Ms. Thompson and Ms. Messick spoke regarding the need for this treatment program for children and their families.

Ms. Lupinacci pointed out that this intervention is also intended to stop the abuse cycle to prevent abused children from becoming abusers.

Mr. Holzmuller stated that it appears that the child victims are able to survive such experiences and lead normal lives.

The Board thanked everyone for their participation in this important discussion.

CALL FOR BIDS - 1986-1987 - COUNTY LEGAL PRINTING.

Commissioner Vaux motioned to issue a Call for Bids for Skagit County legal printing for 1986-1987. Commissioner Walberg seconded the motion. The motion was carried and so ordered.

Bids will be received and publicly opened at 1:30 p.m., Tuesday, March 25, 1986.

2. Vouchers audited and certified by the auditing officer as required by R.C.W. 42.24.080, and those expense reimbursement claims certified as required by R.C.W. 42.24.090, have been recorded on a listing which has been made available to the Board.

REVIEW - APPEAL OF HEARING EXAMINER'S DECISION OF SHORELINE VARIANCE PERMIT #29-85 FOR LISA J. NIELSEN.

Betsy Dwire-Stevenson, Senior Planner, presented a site plan, photos and correspondence received by the Department of Planning and Community Development with regard to Shoreline Variance Permit #29-85 for Lisa J. Nielsen. Ms. Dwire-Stevenson summarized the situation and prior decision of denial by the Hearing Examiner. She also read the Notice of Appeal submitted by Ms. Nielsen.

Ms. Nielsen explained the situation from her point of view, noting that the cover over the boat was only temporary until summer. She stated that she purchased the boat in November, 1984. In June, 1985, she obtained a temporary building permit through October 31, 1985. However, she entered boat building school at approximately that time, which delayed work on her boat. She also expressed concern about the inclusion of her boat as a substantial development, according to the Hearing Examiner's decision. She asked that she be allowed to leave the cover until early March, and leave the boat at its location until completion of repairs in mid September, 1986.

Commissioner Walberg stated that he could understand the concerns of neighbors.

Commissioner Vaux motioned to uphold the Hearing Examiner's decision of denial of Shoreline Variance Permit #29-85 for Lisa J. Nielsen, due to the fact that the boat has been there for 15 months with very little progress made. Commissioner Walberg seconded the motion. The motion was carried and so ordered.

MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS

The Board addressed the following items:

1. The Board approved for signature the Endorsement to the Group Health Care Service Contract for Skagit County Employees which extends the 1985 monthly rates and conditions through 1986.
2. Vouchers audited and certified by the auditing officer as required by R.C.W. 42.24.080, and those expense reimbursement claims certified as required by R.C.W. 42.24.090, have been recorded on a listing which has been made available to the Board.

As of this date, February 11, 1986, the Board, by a majority vote, did approve for payment those vouchers included in the above-mentioned list and further described as follows: Voucher #MW006-10244 (Warrant #10244) in the total amount of \$1,950.00. (C-8)
