The Skagit County Board of Commissioners met in regular session on Wednesday, June 3, 1987, with Commissioners Walberg, Vaux and Rohrer present.

PRESENTATION - ANNUAL SCHOOL ESSAY CONTEST ON DWI AND SAFETY BELT USAGE.

Don McKeehen, DWI/Safety Belt Project Coordinator, explained that this contest was sponsored by the Kiwanians for three different age groups: grades 7 and 8, grades 9 and 10, and grades 11 and 12. The students had a choice of either writing an essay or a radio commercial.

Commissioner Rohrer, Chairman of the DWI Task Force, stated that the winning entries would be displayed in the County Administration rotunda for the public to see.

MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS

1. Jim Koetje, Chairman of the Board of Directors of the 1987 Tulip Festival, and Joan Houchen, Executive Director of the Mount Vernon Chamber of Commerce, updated the Board on the 1987 Tulip Festival.

Mr. Koetje noted that the Tulip Festival came out \$3,000 in the black this year, and this money will be spent on a coordinator for next year's

festival. A new Board of Directors will be organized by July 1, 1987. He stated that they would welcome Mike Woodmansee, Budget and Finance Director, and Jeff Monsen, Traffic Safety Engineer, to again serve on the Board as the County's representatives.

Next year the Tulip Festival will not support the Taste of Skagit, so it will be up to an organization to coordinate that event. The festival has again been scheduled for the first two weeks of April for next year. Mr. Koetje spoke with regard to participation received by other cities and towns in the County.

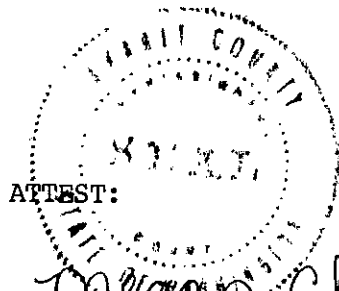
Joan presented a list of corporate, gold, silver and poster sponsors. She expressed appreciation for all the County did to aid the festival, and noted that the Port of Anacortes was generous in allowing the Taste of Skagit to be held on their property.

The Board thanked Ms. Houchen and Mr. Koetje for all they did for the festival and for this update. Ms. Houchen and Mr. Koetje expressed appreciation for the County's cooperation and participation.

2. The Board approved for signature a Contract for Professional Services between the Skagit County Department of Planning and Community Development and Wilsey & Ham for their services consisting of preparation of a draft amendment for the Town of La Conner's Shoreline Master Program, to include the preparation of a master plan to address waterfront development. This contract shall be in effect through project completion or June 30, 1988, and compensation shall not exceed \$10,000.

Commissioner Vaux motioned to adjourn the proceedings. Commissioner Rohrer seconded the motion. The motion was carried unanimously.
