The Skagit County Board of Commissioners met in regular session on Tuesday, October 4, 1988, with Commissioners W. W. Vaux, Kimberly Walberg and Dave Rohrer present.

RESOLUTIONS - APPOINTMENT OF TWO MEMBERS TO THE NORTHWEST SENIOR SERVICES ADVISORY BOARD.

Tim Holloran, Director of the Senior Services Department, introduced Bette Richardson and Lorna Cundiff, candidates for appointment to the Northwest Senior Services Advisory Board.

Commissioner Rohrer motioned to adopt the resolution appointing Bette Richardson to the Northwest Senior Services Advisory Board effective October 3, 1988, with said appointment to expire June 30, 1991. Commissioner Walberg seconded the motion. The motion was carried unanimously. (Resolution #11780)

Commissioner Rohrer motioned to adopt the resolution appointing Lorna Cundiff to the Northwest Senior Services Advisory Board effective October 3, 1988, with said appointment to expire June 30, 1989. Commissioner Walberg seconded the motion. The motion was carried unanimously. (Resolution #11781)

CONTINUED DISCUSSION - INITIATIVE 97/97B.

Discussion regarding Initiative 97 and Initiative 97B, the two toxic waste cleanup proposals, was continued from yesterday.

Alice Hastings stated if she makes a mess, she doesn't expect someone else to clean it up.

Chairman Vaux read an excerpt from R.C.W. 42.36.040, verifying that he was not

in violation of conflict of interest or appearance of fairness because he accepted campaign contributions from individuals supporting Initiative 97B. Chairman Vaux additionally explained he supports Initiative 97B because it will work for the farm community.

Commissioner Walberg thanked Mrs. Madenwald for providing her with copies of both initiatives, which she read and compared, but could not find a great number of differences. She noted that Initiative 97B is currently a law, and she's willing to give it a chance to work. Commissioner Walberg motioned to endorse Initiative 97B.

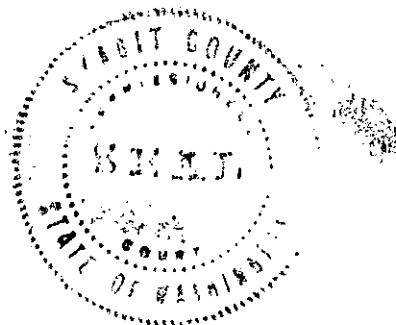

Commissioner Rohrer seconded Commissioner Walberg's motion to endorse Initiative 97B. The motion was carried unanimously.



W. W. Vaux, Chairman




Kimberly Walberg, Commissioner
