The Skagit County Board of Commissioners met in regular session on Tuesday, March 10, 1998, with Commissioners Robert Hart, Ted W. Anderson, and Harvey Wolden present.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT – Chal Martin, Director.

1. Public Hearing – Consideration of Proposed Speed Limit Revision on Blodgett Road, No. 70510.

Chairman Hart opened the Public Hearing. Steve Flude, Assistant County Engineer, reviewed the Engineer's Report and the specific area of the speed limit reduction from 35 miles per hour to 25 miles per hour. There being no public comment forthcoming, Commissioner Wolden moved to close the public hearing. Commissioner Anderson seconded the motion, which passed unanimously. The public hearing was closed.

A brief discussion ensued on the possibility of lowering the speed limit to 30 miles per hour rather than 25 miles per hour as requested by a private citizen.

Commissioner Wolden moved to approve the speed limit reduction to 25 miles per hour on Blodgett Road as proposed by Staff. Commissioner Anderson seconded the motion, which passed unanimously. **(Resolution to be Provided by Staff at a Later Date)**

2. Public Hearing – Establishment of Chilberg Wye Road, No. 42300, as a County Road.

Chairman Hart opened the Public Hearing. Mr. Flude explained that this is just a housekeeping matter to complete the road files for this area. He explained the exact location of the proposed Chilberg Wye Road.

There being no public comment forthcoming, Commissioner Wolden moved to close the public hearing. Commissioner Anderson seconded the motion, which passed unanimously. The public hearing was closed.

Commissioner Hart moved to establish the Chilberg Wye Road. Commissioner Wolden seconded the motion, which passed unanimously. The Board signed the appropriate Road Establishment Order.

3. Public Hearing – Consideration of Road Name Change from Legge Road, No. 00500, to Brotherhood Lane, No. 00500.

Chairman Hart opened the Public Hearing. Mr. Flude explained that his office has received no opposition to this road name change.

Cliff Skelton, property owner along Legge Road, stated that everyone along the road is in favor of approving the road name change.

Phil Corey, Manager of Camp Brotherhood, stated that Camp Brotherhood would be honored to have the road name changed to Brotherhood Lane. He further explained that this change will assist individuals trying to find Camp Brotherhood.

Randy Stime, Camp Brotherhood, stated that at the County line in this area, a "Welcome to Skagit County" sign might be appropriate.

There being no further public comment forthcoming, Commissioner Wolden moved to close the public hearing. Commissioner Anderson seconded the motion, which passed unanimously. The public hearing was closed.

Commissioner Wolden questioned whether the name "Brotherhood Lane" would create confusion, as the term "Lane" generally means a Private Road. Commissioner Wolden indicated that he would prefer the name be changed to "Brotherhood Road." A brief discussion ensued. Commissioner Wolden moved to approve the road name change from Legge Road to Brotherhood Road. Commissioner Anderson seconded the motion, which passed unanimously. **(Resolution to be Provided by Staff at a Later Date)**

4. **Discussion – City of Burlington Request for County Support on Department of Ecology Skagit River Water Quality Standards.**

Dave Brookings, Public Works Administrator, stated that at-issue today is a brief discussion item regarding water quality standards on the Skagit River. He explained that a letter from Margaret Fleek, City of Burlington, asking the County for support on the Department of Ecology Skagit River Water Quality Standards.

The specific impacts to treatment plants and pump stations were reviewed.

Ms. Fleek stated that Mount Vernon, Burlington and Sedro Woolley are working together in this regard. DOE has done a minimal water quality study and has sampled the lower Skagit River for water quality and is now starting to impose water quality standards that will begin to create a hardship on our neighboring cities due to their wastewater treatment plants. This will be an immediate concern for the cities, the County and other jurisdictions who will ultimately have to take action to alleviate the point and non point pollutant loading of fecal coliform found in both the lower and upper Skagit.

A brief discussion ensued.

Chairman Hart noted that there are some things identified that will allow us to segregate out the items that need to be addressed. He stated that there are flaws in the study and that instream flows need to be analyzed further.

Commissioner Wolden queried Ms. Fleek about testing requirements from each jurisdiction.

Commissioner Anderson stated that it is important to consider the cumulative effects, not just what each jurisdiction is putting into the river.

Ms. Fleek indicated that Burlington is trying to get a grant to get their own testing accomplished so that a response can be given to the Department of Ecology.

Chairman Hart commented on the importance of such a study.

The Board indicated their support for this item.

5. **Signature – Request for Proposals for Distribution of Compost Bins.**

Robin LaRue, Public Works Staff, reviewed with the Board a proposal for the distribution of compost bins. This request would include approximately 2,100 to 2,300 bins, which would be distributed in May. There would be no cost to Skagit County as this is included in the recently received grant.

Commissioner Wolden moved for approval of the Request for Proposals for Distribution of Compost Bins. Commissioner Anderson seconded the motion, which passed unanimously. **(Resolution No. 16910)**

6. **Signature – Request for Proposals for Marketability Study for Disposal of Waste-to-Energy Equipment.**

Mr. LaRue asked for approval for a request for proposals to determine the value of waste energy equipment at the Skagit County Transfer Station. He explained that the purpose is to determine the present value of the equipment, the potential market or buyers of the equipment, and to determine potential cost for removal of the subject equipment.

Chairman Hart stated that it is past time to do this. He indicated that in the past there has not been a great deal of interest, but certainly a cursory study is appropriate.

Commissioner Anderson stated that he would like to see emphasis put on the main turbine at the Transfer Station. Chairman Hart concurred with this comment. A brief discussion ensued.

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Commissioner Anderson moved to approve the request for proposals for a marketability study for disposal of waste to energy equipment. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Wolden, and passed unanimously. **(Resolution No. 16911)**

7. Miscellaneous.

Mr. LaRue revisited the issue of reduced fees for litter brought to the Transfer Station by volunteer or civic groups. He gets a number of requests for reduced or waived fees for community type activities. The Town of Concrete has asked to waive or reduce the fee for a clean up project throughout the Town. Mr. LaRue explained that Concrete does not have funds for this program, and they will be utilizing volunteer labor. He advised that he also has received a similar request from the Tulip Festival for the same consideration.

Commissioner Anderson noted that a task force is being formed to address illegal dumping, which should assist in this regard. He further commented that the Town of Concrete has limited budget to accomplish beautification projects within the Town limits.

Chairman Hart noted that if we waive fees for one group, it spread the cost among everyone else. He indicated that perhaps the County should waive tipping fees on volunteer and clean-up projects that can be offset by grant funds that are obtained.

Mr. LaRue indicated that there will be workshop in the future, and DOE assured that there will be a fast turnaround so the money can be utilized this summer. On query from Commissioner Wolden, Mr. LaRue confirmed that fees are waived in the Adopt-a-Road program.

A discussion ensued on various ways to assist these types of organizations. The Board indicated that they would agree to waive the tipping fees for the Town of Concrete. Commissioner Anderson asked that a tab be kept and given to the Board for their information.

MISCELLANEOUS.

1. Vouchers audited and certified by the auditing officer as required by R.C.W. 42.24.080, and those expense reimbursement claims certified as required by R.C.W. 42.24.090, have been recorded on a listing, which has been made available to the Board.

As of this date, March 10, 1998, the Board, by a majority vote, did approve for payment those vouchers included in the above-mentioned list and further described as follows:

Tom Theisen, Architect, advised that the architect's estimate for construction was \$420,000. Mr. Howard advised that he would present a bid award recommendation to the Board within one week.

2) **Public Hearing – Intent to Lease Land Commonly Known as the Nipper Mill Siding at Birdsvie.**

Chairman Hart opened the public hearing.

Jon Aarstad, Parks & Recreation Director, explained the history of the Nipper Mill Siding and the need to issue the intent to lease land pursuant to pertinent RCW's.

Kevin McGoffin, representing the Janicki Family Trust, asked the Board to proceed with the lease of the land commonly known as the Nipper Mill Siding at Birdsvie to the Janicki Family Trust.

There being no further public comment forthcoming, Commissioner Wolden moved to close the public hearing. Commissioner Anderson seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously. The public hearing was closed.

Mr. Aarstad opened the one bid proposal received. The bid was from Mary T. McGoffin and Lisa Janicki for the benefit of the Janicki Family Trust, 103 North Township, Sedro Woolley, WA 98284. The proposed lease rates are as follows:

During Years 1-5 Skagit County will be paid \$1,050 per year.
During Years 6-10 Skagit County will be paid \$1,300 per year.
During Years 11-15 Skagit County will be paid \$1,550 per year.
During Years 16-20 Skagit County will be paid \$1,800 per year.
During Years 21-25 Skagit County will be paid \$2,000 per year.

Mr. Aarstad advised that the bid would be reviewed and a bid award recommendation would be forthcoming to the Board within the next two weeks.

PLANNING & PERMIT CENTER - Roxanne Michael and Tom Karsh, Co-Directors.

1. **Signature – Resolution Approving Interlocal Cooperative Agreements between Skagit County and LaConner School District and Sedro Woolley School District.**

Tom Karsh, Planning & Permit Center Co-Director, explained the history of interlocal cooperative agreements between Skagit County and various school districts within the County.

After a brief discussion, Commissioner Wolden moved to approve the Resolution Approving Interlocal Cooperative Agreements between Skagit County and LaConner School District and Sedro Woolley School District. Chairman Hart seconded the motion. Upon the call for the question, Commissioners Hart and Wolden

voted in favor of the motion, and Commissioner Anderson voted "nay." The motion passed. (Resolution No. 16912)

2. Signature – Interlocal Agreement for the Collection, Distribution and Expenditure of School Impact Fees Between Skagit County and LaConner School District.

Commissioner Hart moved to approve the Interlocal Agreement for the Collection, Distribution and Expenditure of School Impact Fees Between Skagit County and LaConner School District. Commissioner Wolden seconded the motion. Upon the call for the question, Commissioners Hart and Wolden voted in favor of the motion, and Commissioner Anderson voted "nay." The motion passed. (Contract No. 03867)

3. Signature – Interlocal Agreement for the Distribution and Expenditure of School Impact Fees Between Skagit County and Sedro Woolley School District.

Commissioner Wolden moved to approve the Interlocal Agreement for the Collection, Distribution and Expenditure of School Impact Fees Between Skagit County and Sedro Woolley School District. Chairman Hart seconded the motion. Upon the call for the question, Commissioners Hart and Wolden voted in favor of the motion, and Commissioner Anderson voted "nay." The motion passed. (Contract No. 03868)

4. Signature – Resolution Establishing Public Participation Process Regarding Bayview Ridge Urban Growth Area.

Mr. Karsh presented a Resolution concerning the Public Participation Process Regarding Bayview Ridge Urban Growth Area. Mr. Karsh explained that the Resolution states that time constraints preclude use of a CAC or TAC in the public participation process relating to responding to the Growth Management Hearing Board's Decision and Order regarding the invalidation of the Commercial/Industrial lands within the Bayview Ridge Urban Growth Area. After a brief discussion, Commissioner Wolden moved to approve the Resolution as presented by Mr. Karsh. Commissioner Anderson seconded the motion, which passed unanimously. (Resolution No. 16913)

5. Signature – Real Estate Purchase and Sale Agreements for Properties Identified with the Hazard Mitigation Grant.

Corey Schmidt, Assistant Building Official, presented three Real Estate Purchase and Sale Agreements for the Board's consideration pursuant to the Hazard Mitigation Grant. After a brief discussion, Commissioner Anderson moved to approve the Agreements as follows:


