

Skagit County District Court Re-Licensing Clinic

Things to know before getting started

The Skagit County District Court is offering a re-licensing clinic to help people in the community get and stay licensed to drive. The re-licensing clinic is designed to help those with complicated matters preventing them from being licensed. Those who simply have one to three fines in collections may be better served by writing a letter to the judge requesting that their traffic fines be recalled from collections.

Paperwork Required

- To sign up for the re-licensing clinic a person must come to the Skagit County District Court Clerk's Office with their driver's license.
- The clerk will give you a print out of your current case history and some blank motions to fill out.
- A separate motion is to be used for each court. For example, only Burlington Municipal Court cases should be included on the motion for Burlington. Mount Vernon Municipal Court cases on the motion for Mount Vernon.
- Do not make a motion for any Sedro-Woolley cases. We do not have jurisdiction over Sedro-Woolley cases and therefore cannot make arrangements for them.
- Only case types CT and IT should be included on the motion. (criminal traffic and infraction traffic)
- Do not include cases that you have an attorney representing you on currently. These cases cannot be set for the re-licensing clinic. Consult your attorney for help with any fine in collection status.

Failure to Follow Through

If you fail to appear for the re-licensing clinic hearing, your motion will be denied.

Failure to follow through with the courts order will result in your fines being selected for and assigned to collections again.
