In addition to the above-listed mitigation strategies and activities that are currently in place, the Sedro-Woolley School District proposes the following mitigation goals pertaining specifically to earthquake mitigation:

1. To provide for and implement a comprehensive non-structural earthquake mitigation program to secure and stabilize furnishings, equipment, and windows in all buildings and facilities owned by the Sedro-Woolley School District.
2. To provide for and implement a comprehensive utility safety program to place all above-ground utilities within 300 feet of all school district owned buildings and facilities underground to facilitate emergency egress of students and staff and emergency ingress of emergency response personnel following a damaging earthquake.
