Recent Natural Hazard Event History (2003 – 2008):

The 2006 Skagit River flood event caused approximately \$250,000 damage to the District levee. Damage included sloughing of approximately 1,000 lineal feet of rock rip-rap along the river bank and damage to a portion of the levee. Repairs work was coordinated and directed by the Corps of Engineers.
