

4-H CATS

1. For additional important information, please read the 'Guidelines for Animal Exhibitors'.
2. Cats must be under the 4H member's regular care and management for 60 days prior to the official county exhibit activity.
3. No pregnant or nursing cats may be entered.
4. Kittens must have been born between January 1 and April 1 of the current year.
5. Every 4-H member is required to perform a minimum number of herdsmanship (barn duty) hours. This is determined by the superintendent, based on the number of 4-H members participating at fair. A minimum requirement of two hours will be required. **Leaders and all 4-H parents will be responsible for their club's members or children during their assigned herdsmanship hours.**
6. It is responsibility of each member to care for their cat. All members must stay at fair from 9:30 am to 9:00 pm. You must be present at fair every day.
7. Cloverbuds are dismissed at 7:00 pm. They are welcome to take their cats home at that time. They are the only exception! All other cats must stay till barn closes.
8. Cats must be vaccinated against Panleukopenia, Calicivirus, Rhinotracheitis, and Rabies and be dated. All shots are for the safety of the cats. **NO EXCEPTIONS.** Rabies shots must be on Rabies Certificate WS4HF/1.30. Cats are not allowed in the barn until the Fair Vet has checked them. Cats with fleas, ticks, lice, or ear mites will not be allowed in the barn. This is also for safety reasons. Bring your flea comb when doing Vet check. **NO EXCEPTIONS!**
9. Cats must wear a harness at all times. If the cat is out of its cage, it must also wear a leash attached to the harness. This includes VET check.
10. There must always be fresh water for the cat. Dishes for both water and food must be present. Cats must be in full view at all times- Cage decorations cannot hide the cat. Litter boxes may be semi screened- Cages must have covers to protect the cats.
10. Cage Decoration: - This is optional - There should be no decorations on the top off the cage. Make sure to keep your decorations safe for your cat. Your cat must be visible at all times.
11. Primary members may show but they are not competitive and will receive primary awards. They will not be scored in any class.
12. Before leaving at night, cage must be cleaned food, water and litter removed from cage and stored properly or thrown out and area around cage must be clean.
13. WSU Publication EM4810E, Cat Fitting and Showing, will be used as a guide for Showmanship.
14. The cat show will be one day only, Wednesday, August 9th. Cats should be ready for display by 9:30 am. All activities will take place in the show barn.
15. Cat Barn meeting will be held every morning at 9:45 am with Rabbits.
16. Barn Cleaning will begin at 9:30 am so insure everything is ready for the public.
17. Educational Posters will be turned in on Monday August 7th during barn set up from 1 pm – 4 pm.
18. Barn set up will be on the Monday prior to fair from 1:00 pm – 4:00 pm.

- No copyrighted illustrations or cartoons may be used unless permission has been granted. The display must credit any source of copyrighted information used by permission.
- All work must have been created during the current 4-H year.
- All educational displays must be labeled on the back with the following information:
 Name, First and Last
 County
 Club
 Age Division (Cloverbud, Junior, Intermediate, Senior)
 Department (example – Cats)
 (If display is 3D, attach a card with identifying information.)
- Exhibits will be displayed according to the identified 4-H project area in the appropriate barn/building, as space permits.
- Educational displays will be accepted on Monday August 7th during barn set up from 1 pm – 4 pm**, as specified by the 4-H General Rules.
- For displays identified with an animal project area, check individual animal project divisions for specific criteria, if any.
- Entries must be the work of the individual exhibitor.
- Poster surfaces should be flat; no dimensional attachments, no foam core board. Posters minimum size is 14" x 22"; maximum size is 22" x 28."
- Charts and graphs are not dimensional.
