Cavy Barn Set-Up: Sunday, August 7<sup>th</sup>, 1 pm – 4 pm Cavy Vet Check: Tuesday, August 9<sup>th</sup>, 4 pm – 6 pm

- 1. Please review the 4-H Policies, Veterinary Regulations and 4-H Animal Guidelines links. The following Cavy Department rules are in addition to them.
- 2. Cavies must be under the 4-H member's regular care and management for 45 days prior to the official county exhibit activity. Cavies raised by the 4-H member from birth are exempt from the minimum time period.
- 3. Each Cavy exhibitor may enter a maximum of five single cavy entries, but may be limited to fewer because of fair cage availability, personal cage size (prior approval required), and department housing space. Priority will be given to Skagit County exhibitors.
- 4. Permanent ear tags, in the left ear, are required and need to be listed on the vet registration card. If you don't have access to an ear tag, please contact superintendent prior to the vet check for help.
- 5. Exhibitors must bring their own cage cover, feed cup, feed, and water bottle. All equipment should be brought in an enclosed, small storage container with your name on it. Fair will provide cage and bedding material.
- 6. Due to summer daytime temperatures nothing may be placed in the cage that they could hide in, trapping heat or restricting ventilation such as fleece bedding and hiding huts. Exhibitors should check the welfare of their animals every 2 hours.
- 7. After vet check, the cavies will remain in the barn for the duration of the fair. A thin size blanket works great as cage covers overnight.
- 8. Exhibitors should report to the barn at 9 am every morning for the MANDATORY Superintendent meeting. Cavies should be cleaned, fed/watered and department clean by 9:50 am. Fair opens at 10 am.
- 9. Every 4-H member is required to perform a minimum number of herdsmanship (barn duty) hours determined by the superintendent based on the number of 4-H members participating at fair. A minimum requirement of two hours will be required.
- 10. Leaders and all 4-H parents will be responsible for their club's members or child(ren) during their assigned herdsmanship hours.
- 11. Parents will be required to participate in herdsmanship with each of their fair participant dependents. Each parent will need to sign up for a minimum of 1 hour per fair participant per day. This allows us to have adequate oversight in the barn at all times.
- 12. Showmanship attire is required as follows: White button-down, long sleeved shirt, black pants (slacks or jeans). No shorts, sweaters, jackets, short sleeved shirts, shirts with club names or logos. All clothing should be clean and in good shape. Show coats are permitted as long as they do not have the member's name, 4-H club, county, farm name, or logo of any type (4-H clover is permitted).
- 13. 4-H cavies will be judged and may be faulted and/or disqualified as set forth by the ARBA Standard of Perfection guide.
- 14. Sow and Litter: They must consist of a sow and babies from the same litter and under 4 weeks of age at fair. Only 1 entry per exhibitor and will not be counted against their five single cavy entries. Tags are not required for either mom or pups. Acceptance of Sow and Litter will be at the Superintendent's discretion. Notify Superintendent by August 1st for prior approval.

- 5. Exhibits will be displayed according to the identified 4-H project area in the appropriate barn/building, as space permits.
- 6. Educational displays will be accepted along with other non-animal entries on the Friday before Fair, as specified by the 4-H General Rules.
- 7. For displays identified with an animal project area, check individual animal project divisions for specific criteria, if any.
- 8. Entries must be the work of the individual exhibitor.
- 9. Poster surfaces should be flat; no dimensional attachments, no foam core board. Posters minimum size is 14" x 22"; maximum size is 22" x 28."
- 10. Charts and graphs are not dimensional.
