

## 4-H DAIRY CATTLE

1. Please read the Guidelines for Animal Exhibitors at the beginning of this section.
2. Dairy animals must be under the 4-H member's regular care and management for 90 days prior to the official county exhibit activity.
3. Limit of 2 animals per class, total of 10 animals.
4. 4-H Dairy Certificate must be provided for each animal exhibited.
5. Animals must be dehorned and Bangs vaccinated. It is strongly recommended that each animal be vaccinated for respiratory diseases prior to the Fair.
6. No bulls.
7. Animals must be double tied—halter plus neck tie.
8. When showing, exhibitors are required to wear clean white pants and tucked in, clean white shirt—no crop, tank or halter tops, shorts or capris. For safety reasons, exhibitors are required to wear sturdy leather boots or shoes—no sandals, flip flops, rubber boots or tennis shoes are allowed.
9. Posters are REQUIRED for each exhibitor. Posters must about a dairy related or agricultural subject.
10. Each club is REQUIRED to create an educational display.
11. A supervising parent, 4-H leader or responsible adult over 18 years of age must be present every day of the fair to supervise exhibitor.
12. Each exhibitor is required to participate in either Dairy Foods or Dairy Demonstrations (Division I or Division J).

#### Awards: Showmanship

Awards will be presented to the Champion Junior, Intermediate and Senior dairy showmen.

#### Division I: Dairy Foods Demonstration

The presentation should include the promotion, historical or cultural aspects, and the economic impact of the dairy industry on our state. Information about the dairy products used and knowledge of the nutritional components of the dairy ingredients must be included in the presentation. It is recommended that participants serve the judges a sample of the food prepared. Use of posters is encouraged. Participants must be signed up in the dairy project to be eligible for premium.

Special Award: Dairy Foods Demonstration awards to the top Skagit County 4-H members in each age bracket, sponsored by the Skagit County Dairy Women.

## Division L: Educational Posters

1. Scorecard C0679 will be used to judge all educational displays. Refer to scorecard when planning display.
2. No copyrighted illustrations or cartoons may be used unless permission has been granted. The display must credit any source of copyrighted information used by permission.
3. All work must have been created during the current 4-H year.
4. All educational displays must be labeled on the back with the following information:  
Name, First and Last  
County  
Club  
Age Division (Cloverbud, Junior, Intermediate, Senior)  
Department (example – Dairy Cattle)  
(If display is 3D, attach a card with identifying information.)
5. Exhibits will be displayed according to the identified 4-H project area in the appropriate barn/building, as space permits.
6. **Educational displays will be accepted on Tuesday during haul in.**
7. For displays identified with an animal project area, check individual animal project divisions for specific criteria, if any.
8. Entries must be the work of the individual exhibitor.
9. Poster surfaces should be flat; no dimensional attachments, no foam core board. Posters minimum size is 14" x 22"; maximum size is 22" x 28."
10. Charts and graphs are not dimensional.
