

The following scenarios were created from multiple interviews done with front-line stakeholders in the Skagit community. These scenarios were created to represent the diversity of the homeless population within the community. Additionally, they help to illuminate the multiple system barriers that are faced daily by these individuals and those called to serve them. Each represents aspects of a commonly seen "person" by those working hand-in-hand with the most vulnerable in the Skagit community. In that way, they are avatars of a typical day in the life of people experiencing homelessness and housing insecurity.

The scenarios are not based on "real" people or specific encounters, and they are not intended to capture every possible detail, barrier, or process step. The goal is to identify the most important elements and themes that affect the many Skagitonians who face homelessness and housing insecurity. Adequately addressing homelessness requires both individual-level change and system change. That change can only happen through partnerships that are based on mutual understanding. As the North Star project progresses, we will use the scenarios to pressure-test potential solutions, assessing the impact that a proposed measure would have on each individual in the scenarios.


Daniel: The Ideal System




Daniel: The Ideal System (In-Progress Revision)




