What you can do to stop the spread of respiratory illnesses:

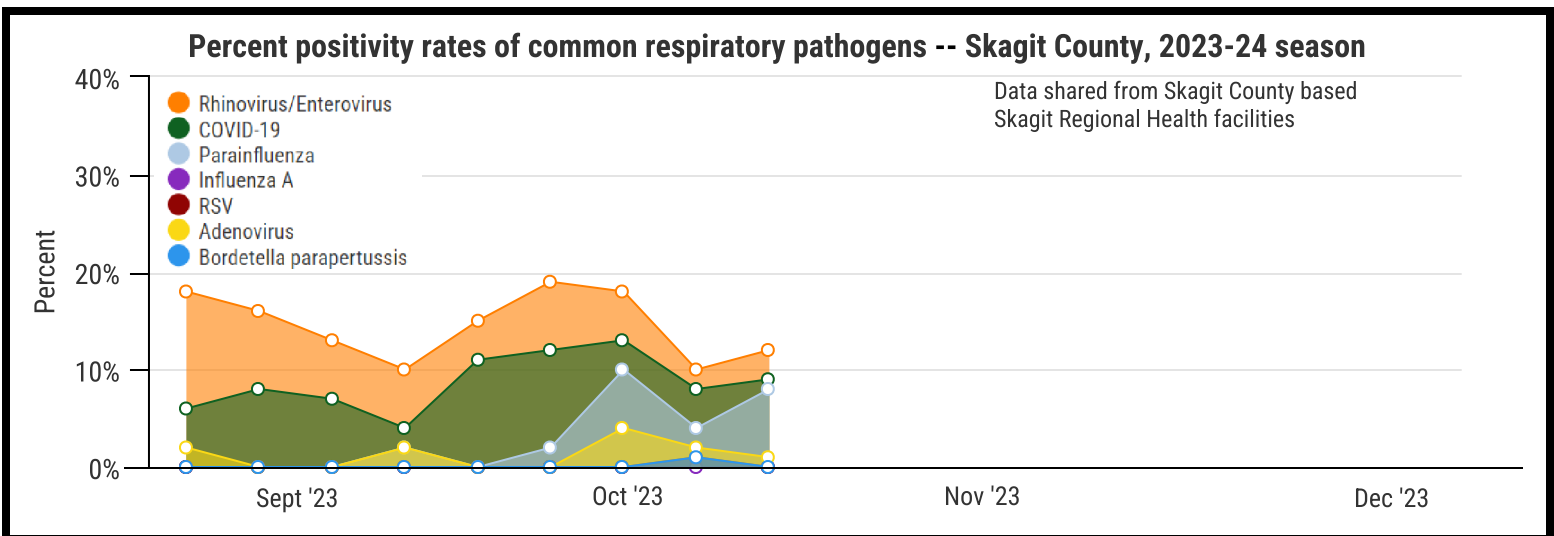
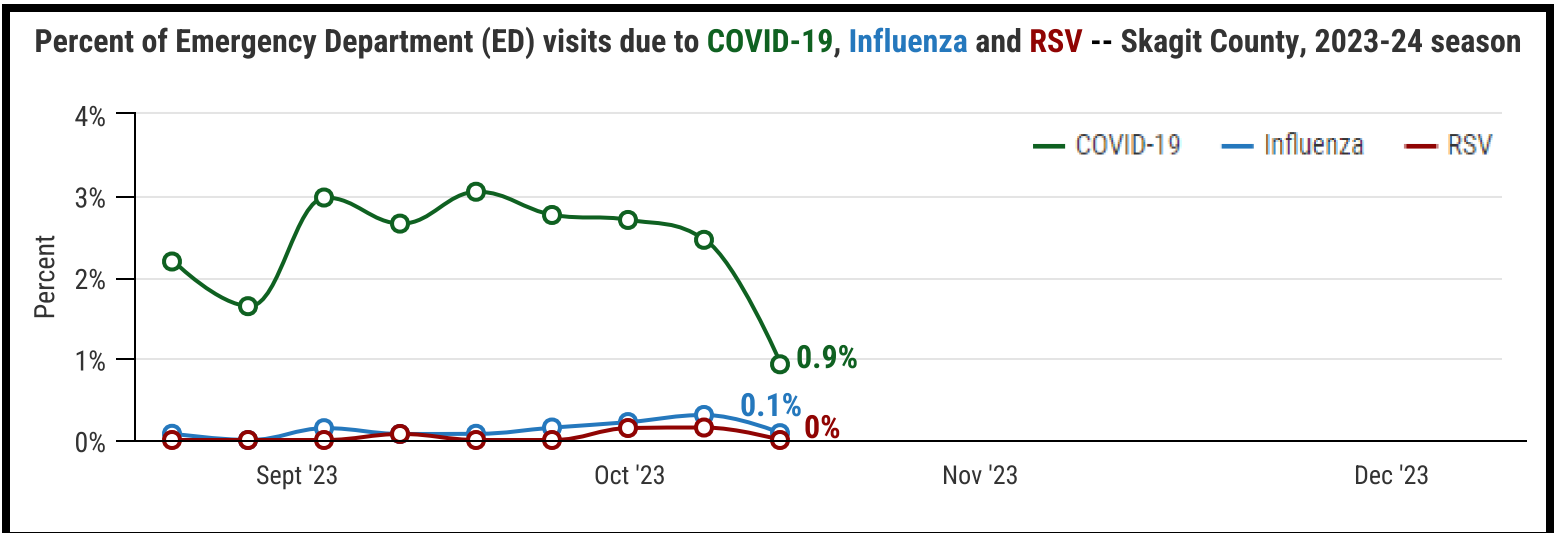
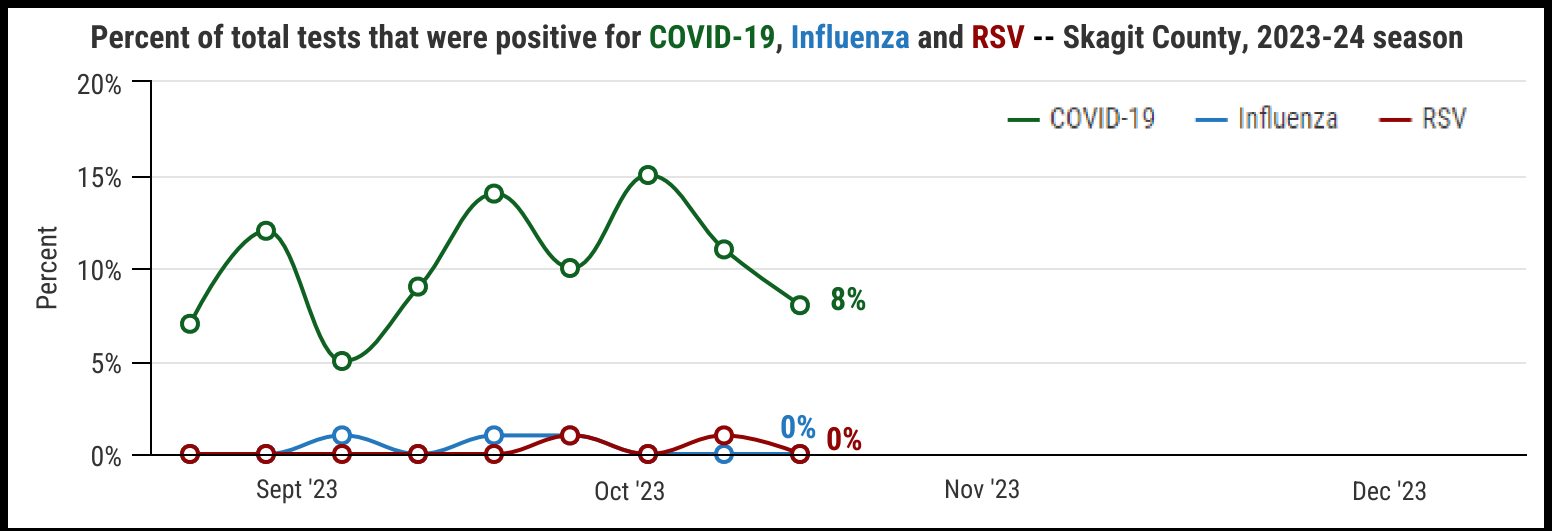
-  Wash your hands frequently.
-  Cover your coughs and sneezes.
-  Stay home when you are sick, and test when possible.
-  Get a seasonal influenza vaccine and stay up to date on COVID-19 vaccine. Ask your provider about RSV vaccine if you are eligible.

*Due to seasonality of Influenza and RSV, surveillance occurs between October 1 and May 31. To date, COVID-19 has not shown a clear seasonal pattern, so data shown are according to the respiratory illness season pattern for comparison purposes.
